CONSISTORY HIGHLIGHTS June 9, 2025

- The outside review of financial transactions is completed with no issues identified, but there may be some recommendations
- forthcoming.

 Regarding the Task Force for building improvement, a contract with Killian painting has been signed. A 24,000 BTU unit was chosen for air conditioning of the chapel. Office remodeling will not begin until later in the year. Roller shades are being purchased for the Chapel.
- With significant increases in the valuation of the church and parsonage since the last valuation done in 2017, the annual insurance premium increases as well. While the Deacons recommended increasing our coverage, it was suggested to investigate the difference in premium cost if the deductible was raised to \$5,000 or \$10,000.
- A new Building/Fellowship Hall reservation and rental form was reviewed, but action was tabled until the next meeting.

 Proceeds from fair gate coverage will go to the operating fund.

 Commemorative plates with photos of our current and previous
- church buildings will be available to anyone who would like them on Anniversary/Rally Day. Remaining plates will be repurposed to an organization to use for art projects.
- It was stressed that leaders of all teams and boards be aware that the pastor and chairperson of Consistory are ex-officio members of all boards and teams and are to be notified in advance of all meetings.
- Funds in the Shiarla farm account have been disbursed to the recipients as outlined in the Annual Report.
- Ministerial CD This CD matures in mid-July and Bob questioned whether to reinvest the interest earned. There are potential uses being investigated and contacts will be made with
- other individuals prior to deciding.
 On Sunday, September 7 (Rally Day) Funday for children will begin at 9:00 AM. Sunday School begins on September 14. Mike is to check on availability of the pool for outdoor worship services during the summer of 2026.

Sonnenberg Donation Task Force

The Sonnenberg Donation Task Force met with Gib Sonnenberg and his son John on May 19. The purpose of the meeting was to go over the plans that have been developed to utilize the donation from Gib and the late Dona Sonnenberg.

The plans thus far have been approved by Consistory, and include the following: Repair and painting of the ceilings in the chapel, Sunday school hall, coat room, narthex and Fellowship Hall; installation of an air conditioning/heat pump unit in the Chapel; the purchase of additional chairs for the chapel; installation of a remote controlled shade for the window in the Chapel; a complete renovation of the church office, including new cabinetry and flooring; painting of the walls and ceilings in the office, pastor's study, and

With this work being done, there will be some of the donation money in reserve to cover overages in costs of the work. If there are funds left over after the completion of the work, TheTask Force will go back to the donor for additional guidance on projects that the family may also want to see completed.

The Task Force appreciates everyone's cooperation while the work will be in progress. There will need to be a temporary relocation of the office when the demolition and reconstruction takes place.

On behalf of the Task Force, Consistory, and the entire congregation, we thank Gib and Donna Sonnenberg, along with their children, for the decision to donate these funds, and for their input to the Task Force of their desires to see the donation utilized for the betterment of our church building.
