ABOUT HOOC

Houston's Orchestra On Call brings volunteer musicians together to perform in different medical settings in Houston. These include hospitals, senior care centers, nursing homes, hospices, rehabilitation centers, medical schools and other health care facilities, health-related societies and associations.

The mission of Houston's Orchestra On Call is to provide live musical performances for patients and residents in order to enhance their lives as they go through the process of diagnosis, treatment and recovery within a medical setting and to relieve emotional and mental stress in patients, residents, families, doctors and staff.

Houston's Orchestra On Call is made up of two programs: the Chamber Orchestra and the On Call musicians. The **Chamber Orchestra** provides live music in open spaces such as lobbies, lounges, halls, auditoriums and parks. The repertoire ranges from classical to pops and seasonal. The **On Call** program involves smaller ensembles (duos, trios, quartets and solo) that perform in more intimate spaces. Repertoire is tailored to suit the needs of the audience and setting.

Since its inception, Houston's Orchestra On Call musicians have performed for audiences at Belmont Village Senior Care, Garden Terrace Alzheimer's Center, MD Anderson Cancer Center, Ben Taub Hospital, Shriners Hospital for Children, Texas Children's Hospital, The Menninger Clinic, Houston Hospice, Institute for Spirituality and Health, Amazing Place Adult Day Care Center, Nora' Home Hospitality House and more.
