
AT FEATHER LAKE

On May 21, Feather Lake Wildlife Sanctuary experienced a significant fire. There have been other small fires at Feather Lake in the past, but nothing approaching the size of this one. The El Paso Fire Department estimated it affected 32 of the 43.5 acres at our sanctuary.

The fire started at the back of the basin, at the outlet, where construction has been in progress since late January to install 2 water-control gates. The apparent cause was welding activity at the construction site. The fire advanced across the entire basin but – thanks to combined efforts of the El Paso, Horizon and Tigua fire departments; the El Paso and Socorro police departments; and Emergency Services Districts #1 and #2 – no structures at the sanctuary (except one trail bench) and no surrounding properties were affected.

The vegetation at the sanctuary was hit hard. The fire cleared extensive stands of trees, brush and cattails. We will lose a number of trees, but already we are seeing signs of recovery. Cattails are re-emerging. Wolfberry and spiny aster shoots are poking through the charred soil along the trail encircling the basin. Honey mesquites and tornillo are crownsprouting from their burnt bases, as are some cottonwoods.

Want to see how recovery from the fire is proceeding? Our next workday at Feather Lake will be **Sat.**, **Aug 9**, starting at **8 a.m.** Join us. Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

Total rainfall at Rio Bosque Wetlands Park was 4.01 inches in 2023 and 2.69



inches in 2024. So far in 2025, the total has been 1.44 inches. For many nesting bird species, the prolonged drought has not been kind. We were excited in late April when both a **White-tailed Kite** pair and a **Cooper's Hawk** pair began constructing and then occupying nests. The females were consistently on the nests throughout May and early June. Then, as the weather warmed in June, both nests were abandoned.

From 2018 to 2023, **Yellow-billed Cuckoos** were consistently present at the park during summer. Last year, they were detected only briefly in May. This year, they have not been detected at all. **Burrowing Owl** nesting success at the park is again down, as are **Painted Bunting** numbers. In the northern Chihuahuan Desert, periodic drought plays a significant role in shaping native ecosystems. But watching this process play out can be difficult.

2025 Fall Birdathon El Paso/Trans-Pecos Audubon October 4-5, 2025

The fall will be here before you know it, and that means our October 2025 Birdathon will be taking place. To increase the chances of seeing many fall migrants we are holding this year's Birdathon on October 4th and 5th.

Birdathon is this chapter's single fundraising event and is essential to our organization's funding of local education and conservation programs. Over 95% of Birdathon income goes to these projects. All donations are tax deductible as allowed by law. This year's donations will benefit the following:

- Rio Bosque Wetland Park each year this site along the Rio Grande becomes more valuable as a site for birds and wildlife and conservation education
- Audubon Texas a highly effective voice for birds, wildlife and habitat conservation.
- El Paso/Trans-Pecos Audubon Society chapter operations.
- El Paso Zoo Raptor Rehabilitation this program is solely funded by donations and is the only facility in our area caring for injured raptors.
- Second Chance Wildlife our local wildlife rehabilitation facility caring for injured birds and other wildlife for release to the wild.

How Birdathon Works: counters go out for a 24-hour period and find as many species of birds as possible. Donors choose to support one or more counters by pledging to either pay a dollar amount for each species seen by their counter(s) or pay a fixed amount. Each counter typically sees from 50 to 100 birds.

This year, our counters will be Jim Paton, John Kiseda, John Groves, Eddie Chew, Lucretia Chew, Susie Schneider, Kevin Floyd, Joe Cancellare, Star Posada, Richard Hermosillo, John Sproul, Elizabeth Wakefield and Scott Cutler.

This is a great opportunity to make a substantive impact on the wellbeing of our local environment and the birds and other wildlife that inhabit it with us. Thank you for your support.
