HAZZAN'S NOTES



L'shanah Tovah Umteukah! May you have a sweet, happy, and healthy New Jewish year 5780!

This month of October brings us two most special events on our religious calendar.

The first event is the white fast of Yom Kippur. I want to remind you that because Yom Kippur falls so late on the secular calendar this year, Kol Nidre will begin earlier than in recent years past because it must begin by Jewish Law (halacha) before sunset. Therefore, please make early dinner arrangements and be advised, the service will begin that night **promptly at 6:15 pm** and once the ark is opened and the Torah scrolls are removed for Kol Nidre, the doors to the sanctuary will be closed by the ushers until this section of the service is completed (about 15-20 minutes or so). This will allow for no disruptions during this very important part of the service and you will be able to hear and see the ceremony from the foyer.

Yom Kippur Morning services will begin at 9:30 am as they have for the last few years and Minchah, Yizkor, and Neilah will commence at 4:00 pm so that we can conclude by sundown which is earlier this year since we are later in the secular calendar.

The second special event this month is the festival of Sukkot. We will need help on Sunday, October 13 between 9-11am in the courtyard of First Friends where Mark Singer will direct the erecting of our Sukkah. This is not a one-person event; we need all the help we can to set up our Sukkah. Palm Fronds and decorations for the Sukkah will be provided through the assistance of our Religious Vice-President, Alita Sevin. The Erev Sukkot service will take place that night followed by a wonderful festive oneg in the Sukkah. We will also make use of the Sukkah for Shabbat Hol Hamoed Sukkot on October 18 and then we will also need help to take down and pack our Sukkah on Sunday, October 20. That night, we conclude the High Holyday season with our Erev Sh'mini Atzeret/Simchat Torah service beginning at 6:30 pm. Processions with our Torah scrolls and Yizkor will be a highlight of this service. You will want to attend!

We look forward to seeing you for these special events in our religious calendar!

Parasha Yaylech Deuteronomy 31:1-30

The parasha Vaylech is read in the synagogue on the sixth of TISHRI (October 5). This is the Shabbat between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. It is also celebrated as Shabbat Shuvah and occurs during the Ten Days of Awe. This is a solemn period of prayer in which all Jews ask for G-d's forgiveness of their sins.

The parasha is summarized by Moses' commitment of the law to the priests and Levites and when he chooses Joshua as his successor.

- 1. **Study of the Torah** In this Torah parasha we learn that it not sufficient just to listen to the readings of the law. We must hear the law, then study it, and then to observe it's application to life (Deuteronomy 31:12). This means that there can be no true observance without thorough and regular study.
- 2. **Change of Command** Having reached the age of 120 Moses is ready to die. He meets with Joshua and "in sight of Israel" transfers the leadership of our people to him. Moses tells him, "Be strong and resolute, for it is you who shall go with this people into the land...and it is you who shall apportion it to them...Fear not and do not be dismayed" (Deuteronomy 31:1-8). Concisely, Joshua was chosen because of his demonstrated commitment to Moses and his loyalty to the Jewish people.
- 3. A Notable Mitzvot—assembling all people to hear the Torah read every seven years. On he first of the intermediate days of Sukkot trumpets were sounded to proclaim to all who came to celebrate the festival in Jerusalem that they should assemble (Deuteronomy 31:12). The assembly was called the mitzvah of hakel (gathering together). Due to its setting it increased a special interest of the people in the Torah and all that it stands for.

The main foundation of Jewish life is the Torah. For through it we Jews are distinguished to enjoy a special spiritual pleasure. All of us—men, women and children—should come together to hear it read at Beth Shalom during the present Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur holidays.
