

FINANCE

PROBLEMS and how they can be solved-

1. Some time ago the question was asked, "what does the word <u>incur</u> mean"? A quick look in a good dictionary could have solved this problem. INCUR – " to become liable or subject to one's own actions; bring upon one's self."

EXAMPLE – "I will pay for expenses incurred". Each Unit or District should have a Finance Committee or Treasurer who oversees the payment of proper expenses submitted to them so they can make payment as provided for in their budget or in a duly organized meeting. When that individual goes outside the rules of their organization they are making themselves liable for any of their own actions.

2. BAD CHECKS – being submitted to the Department Secy-Treas---There is no excuse for this—whoever is in charge of your check book should immediately upon making a deposit to your account or when writing a check or checks, put that amount in your check register and bring balance forward so you know what is in your account before forwarding the checks you have written. This raises another question "have you written checks to others that will bounce'? It is very important that your keep your check book or register up to date. There is a bad check fee charged to the depositor plus the bad check writer. The Department will collect the face amount of the check PLUS the bad check fee so the organization isn't losing money due to some bad bookkeeping procedures.

3. DESIGNATED FUNDS – the Unit or District may receive designated funds from a member or group. Those monies must be spent for what the designation states, otherwise this is misappropriation of funds and can be qualified as embezzlement or to use for illegal purposes. The donor can be contacted to find out if the money can be used for any other purpose, but their reply must be duly made a part of your official minutes.

4. TIMELY CASHING OF CHECKS – the Department office has outstanding checks written by them to individuals that has not been cashed. Sometimes these checks will not be cashed for 5 to 7 months and sometimes they can be outstanding as long as a year. This is bad bookkeeping procedure and time consuming for the accountants because they have to be carried on the books until time of cashing.

Legislative

March 2019

Greetings Ladies,

On January 17th, 2019, Committee Member Anita Ritter attended a meeting hosted by Arizona State Legislators to discuss their agendas for this legislative session. Several items discussed referred to veteran affairs.

On January 23rd, 2019, Committee Member Anita Ritter attended an Arizona State Senate Hearing. State Senator Tony Navarette; spoke about several issues and bills to be presented regarding health issues. Nothing about veteran affairs was discussed at this time.

On January 25th, 2019, President Trump and congressional leaders reached a short-term deal to reopen the government for three weeks while negotiations continue over funding for the border wall.

On February 5th, 2019, President Trump gave his State of the Union Address which covered a wide range of topics. He opened his speech with Bipartisanship, stating that he hoped that we will govern not as two parties, but as one nation. He then moved on to the economy and cited a record low minority unemployment rate. He then covered the Russia Investigation. Next, he introduced Alice Johnson and spoke of criminal justice reform. He also mentioned, "The First Step Act" which gives non-violent offenders the chance to re-enter society as productive law-abiding citizens. Trump then moved on to the wall, where he reaffirmed his call for a barrier on the border. Next, he discussed women and their roles in politics today. He spoke of how we now have more women serving in Congress than ever before. He talked of trade and international relations and replacing NAFTA. He also detailed a number of foreign policy priorities. He then moved on to the topic of late term abortions. The President concluded his speech in the same way he began, calling on Members of Congress to overcome political and personal differences, and work together toward a common goal.

As this bulletin is being drafted on February 14th, Senate confirms Trump's pick William Barr for Attorney General.

Also on February 14th, the U.S. Senate Okayed a border deal; Trump would sign the bill and take other executive action including declaring a National Emergency to fund a border wall. This deal would hopefully prevent another government shutdown.
