On December 9, Janis Lipman will be speaking to Men for Brandeis Activities (MBA). Her topic will be A Short History of the US Electric Utility Industry and Tales from Developing a \$1 Billion Power Plant. The power plant is the Towantic Energy Center in Oxford, Connecticut. Its completion was the culmination of twenty years of effort by Ms. Lipman, through her company, Arena Capital Ltd.

JANUARY 13 - DR WILLIAM HERY - Dr. Hery, although not a historian, is an expert on activities that took place at Bletchley Park, UK during WW II. He will speak on that topic. Dr. Hery is a retired scientist/engineer at Bell Labs and is on the faculty of NYU's Tandon School of Engineering (formerly Brooklyn Polytechnic).

Sacha Baron Cohen Portrays Abbie Hoffman '59 in New Netflix Drama

November 4, 2020

Champion of Flower Power.
Founder of the Yippies. Defendant in the Chicago 7 conspiracy trial.

And the guy who sold the subs on the Brandeis campus.

Abbot "Abbie" Hoffman '59 (1936-1989) was a man of parts. Portrayed by Sacha Baron Cohen in Aaron Sorkin's new Netflix film <u>The Trial of the Chicago 7</u>, Sixties counterculture icon Hoffman occupies a distinctive place in Brandeis lore.

He was both a radical and a jokester," writes historian Stephen Whitfield, PhD '72, the Max Richter Professor of American Civilization, Emeritus, at Brandeis, spotlighting Hoffman in his newly -released book, Learning on the Left: Political Profiles of Brandeis University.

"He was the merriest activist that the left ever bestowed on America," Whitfield writes.

"Bouncing through the late 1960s and the 1970s with kinetic energy, Hoffman held a 'flower in a clenched fist,' he later insisted. Inside it, he should have mentioned, was a joy buzzer, to be pressed against the body politic."

Hoffman's antic behavior in court made headlines during the Chicago 7 trial in 1969; his skill on the (tennis) court was noted at Brandeis 10 years earlier.



Honoring Our History

The University Photography Collection

In many homes there are boxes and albums inherited by family members that are fading and deteriorating with the passage of time. So many faces and past celebrations that can no longer be identified. What are the forgotten stories that surround these photos? A family history lost forever.

It is said that "a picture is worth a thousand words." This month we would like to highlight the University Photography Collection.

The Brandeis University Photography Collection comprises over 100,000 photo negatives, taken over the course of the history of the institution from the beginning to the recent past. The collection provides rich visual documentation of Brandeis University's unique history and development, showcasing the influential people, places and events associated with the school in its founding years, including the Brandeis University National Women's Committee (now the Brandeis National Committee).

The University Photography Collection is among the most actively used collections in the University Archives. Brandeis students, faculty, staff, alumni and administrators, as well as community researchers, request the use of images for scholarly publications, research papers, presentations, classroom lectures, documentary films, exhibits, publicity materials, museum publications and university celebrations.

Digital access to these images of historical importance will provide a valuable service to the research community and will preserve vulnerable early photographic images. Degradation of original acetate negatives is progressive and irreversible; digitization will serve to capture and preserve their informational value before it is permanently lost.

Two of them are also included on page 8, in the Brandeis Happenings article. Please join us in helping to ensure that these remarkable photographs will not fade and deteriorate.
