


injury is covered. For more info, see the AACA website or J. C. Taylor's website.

The Emerys received the "tough luck" award. Good fun was had by all. Much appreciation and many thanks to Wayne and Gloria Burgess, Tour Chairpersons, and all the members of the Northern neck Region AACA for the hospitality and smoothness of a wonderfully constructed tour. 


