# "Isaiah" Learning from Isaiah's Visions

## Theme: *Before we Judge others, we need to examine ourselves.*

I. The vision that changed Isaiah forever.

## A. Summarize what Isaiah saw in His vision:

**Isaiah 6:1–4** — "<sup>1</sup> In the year of King Uzziah's death I saw the Lord sitting on a throne, lofty and exalted, with the train of His robe filling the temple. <sup>2</sup> Seraphim stood above Him, each having six wings: with two he covered his face, and with two he covered his feet, and with two he flew. <sup>3</sup> And one called out to another and said, "Holy, Holy, Holy, is the Lord of hosts, The whole earth is full of His glory." <sup>4</sup> And the foundations of the thresholds trembled at the voice of him who called out, while the temple was filling with smoke."

- 1. When did He see it? V1
- 2. Who did He see? V1
- 3. How did He see Him? v1-2
- 4. What did he hear about Him? v3
- 5. What did He feel? V4

### B. What is Isaiah's immediate response to seeing this vision?

**Isaiah 6:5** — "<sup>5</sup> Then I said, "Woe is me, for I am ruined! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, the Lord of hosts.""

- 1. What did Isaiah feel about himself? -v5a
  - a. Compare that to Isaiah 5: v8, v11, v18, v20, v22
  - b. Now who was seen as worthy of "woe"?
- 2. What two things did Isaiah discover about himself? -v5b
- 3. What was the reason he saw this about himself? -v5c

C. Lesson: Until there is an awareness of our sinfulness, we see no need for

- 1. Read James 4:6 What is needed to draw on God's empowering grace?
  - a. See also 1 Peter 5:5 "opposed" is literally continually opposed.
- 2. **Conclusion:** Pride \_\_\_\_\_\_ grace in our direction.

#### II. God's response to Isaiah's humility: -v6

**Isaiah 6:6–7** — "<sup>6</sup> Then one of the seraphim flew to me with a burning coal in his hand, which he had taken from the altar with tongs. <sup>7</sup> He touched my mouth with it and said, "Behold, this has touched your lips; and your iniquity is taken away and your sin is forgiven.""
