Jewish Prayer and Study

Whether we are praying, studying Torah, and the other books of the Tanach, we are reading the words of G-d and show respect. It is forbidden to pray or perform any religious study in the bathroom. All other rooms in our homes are considered proper. Let us always remember to give our religious studies the respect and honor they deserve.

<u>Laws of the Brochos</u> When we receive a gift from a relative or a friend we show our appreciation by thanking them in some way. So how do we show our appreciation to the father of all of us who has given us the greatest gift of all, the gift of life and all the wonders of the world. We thank him. We recite "Brochos" blessings. These are found in most "Siddur" prayer books.

Because the blessings are important we must always concentrate on what we are saying to G-d. When we recite a Brocho to G-d, therefore we must learn the proper blessing beforehand so that when we recite it we do it without hesitation and with meaning. It should come from our hearts.

For example: If we wanted to eat fruit and recited the blessing, for the fruit and then changed our mind about eating the fruit and put it away, we would be reciting a Brocha in vain. Mentioning the name of G-d (which is in the middle of the blessing) in vain would be disrespectful and against the law. We must make up our mind before we recite "Brocha" for anything. In this way, we can avoid disrespect to G-d.

When someone recites a "Brocha" and we are nearby, we should make it a habit to answer "Amen". The Hebrew letters of "amen" are the initials of "El Melech Ne-eman," G-d is a faithful king. It is the Jewish way of saying that all we heard is true.
