

LIDERAZGO DE LOS OBISPOS DE LOS EE.UU DENUNCIAN LA TERMINACIÓN DEL PROGRAMA DE DACA DESPUÉS DE SEIS MESES.



"La cancelación del programa DACA es censurable. Esto causa un miedo innecesario para DACA jóvenes y sus familias. Estos

jóvenes entró a los EE.UU. como menores de edad y, a menudo sabe Latina como su único hogar. La Iglesia Católica siempre ha mirado con orgullo y admiración como DACA la juventud vivir sus vidas diarias con la esperanza y la determinación de prosperar y contribuir a la sociedad: continuar trabajando y mantener a sus familias, sin dejar de prestar el servicio militar, y continuando a recibir una educación. Ahora, después de meses de ansiedad y temor sobre su futuros, estos valientes jóvenes se enfrentan a la deportación. Esta decisión es inaceptable y no refleja lo que somos como estadounidenses.

La Iglesia ha reconocido y proclamado la necesidad de acoger a los jóvenes: 'El que recibe a uno de estos niños en mi nombre me acoge; y el que me recibe a mí, no a mí sino al que me ha enviado' (Marcos 9:37) no es bienvenido. Hoy, nuestra nación ha hecho lo contrario de cómo la Escritura nos llama a responder. Es un paso atrás de los avances que tenemos que hacer como país. Las acciones de hoy representan un momento desgarrador en nuestra historia que muestra la ausencia de misericordia y buena voluntad, y una visión miope para el futuro. DACA jóvenes se tejen en la tela de nuestro país y de nuestra Iglesia, y son, por cada medida social y humano, la juventud americana.

Instamos enérgicamente al Congreso a actuar y reanudar el trabajo hacia una solución legislativa inmediatamente. Pedimos apoyo para trabajar en la búsqueda de un medio rápido de protección para DACA juventud.



Leadership of US Bishops Denounce Administration's Decision to End DACA; Urge Congress to Find Solution (September 5, 2017)



"The cancellation of the DACA program is reprehensible. It causes unnecessary fear for DACA youth and their families.

These youth entered the U.S. as minors and often know America as their only home. The Catholic Church has long watched with pride and admiration as DACA youth live out their daily lives with hope and a determination...to contribute to society: to work and provide for their families, to serve in the military, to receive an education. Now, after months of anxiety and fear about their futures, these ...young people face deportation. This decision is unacceptable and does not reflect who we are as Americans.

The Church has recognized and proclaimed the need to welcome young people: 'Whoever welcomes one of these children in my name welcomes me; and whoever welcomes me does not welcome me but the one who sent me' (Mark 9:37). Today, our nation has done the opposite of how Scripture calls us to respond. It is a step back from the progress that we need to make as a country. Today's actions represent a heartbreaking moment in our history that shows the absence of mercy and good will, and a short-sighted vision for the future. DACA youth are woven into the fabric of our country and of our Church, and are, by every social and human measure, American youth.

We strongly urge Congress to act and immediately resume work toward a legislative solution. As people of faith, we say to DACA youth – regardless of your immigration status, you are children of God and welcome in the Catholic Church. 

Birthday Of Mary: Some Background



The Feast of the Nativity of Mary began to be observed in the West in the 7th century brought there by Eastern monks. From the 13th century on, the celebration assumed notable importance, becoming a Solemnity. Her birth date through the centuries was celebrated on different dates from place to place. However,

when the Feast of the Immaculate Conception... was proclaimed, her birth date was assigned to September 8 since it is nine months after the Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception.

The Gospels do not provide us anything about the birth of the Virgin Mary. Their attention is completely centered on the mystery of Christ and His salvific mission. In the case of all the other saints, the Church commemorates their birthday on the day of their return to the Lord. However, in the cases of St. John the Baptist and the Blessed Virgin, the Church celebrates the day of their earthly birth. The reason for this has to do with their unique missions in the history of salvation. The birth of Mary is considered to be, like that of John the Baptizer, in direct relationship with the coming of the Savior of the world. Thus, the birth and existence of Mary takes on a significance that transcends her own person. It is explained solely in the context of the history of salvation, connected with the People of God of the Old Covenant and the New.

Mary's birth lies at the confluence of the two Testaments. It brings an end the stage of expectation in the Old and inaugurates the new times of grace and salvation in Jesus Christ in the New. The birth of Mary...is indissolubly connected with that of Christ. God's mysterious plan regarding the incarnation of the Word embraces also the Virgin who is His Mother.
