Legislative

March 2020

Greetings,

February 3rd, 2020 the first Presidential Caucuses occurred in Iowa. Eleven Democratic Party candidates faced off for 49 delegates, while incumbent President Trump faced two Republican challengers for 40 delegates. There were significant irregularities in the Democratic Party process that were reported with an app being blamed for widespread confusion and delayed results. The victor of the Democratic Party in the caucus was Buttigieg with 14 delegate votes. President Trump was announced the victor on the Republican Party side.

February 4th, 2020 President Trump delivered his third State of the Union Address to the 116th United States Congress in the chamber of the House of Representatives.

February 5th, 2020 President Trump was acquitted by the U.S. Senate on both articles of impeachment. The investigation, hearings and trial lasted 84 days and drew to a close that afternoon. Article 1 votes were as counted, Guilty - 48, Not Guilty - 52. Article 2 votes were as counted, Guilty - 47, Not Guilty - 53.

February 6th, 2020 President Trump delivers press conference on impeachment decision.

February 7th, 2020 U.S. President Trump fires National Security Council advisor Lt. Col. Alexander Vindman and E.U. ambassador Gordon Sondland, who both testified as witnesses at the impeachment inquiry against him. Vindman's twin brother, Lt. Col. Yevgeny Vindman, an Army JAG officer is also fired.

February 11th, 2020 Democratic Party presidential primaries were held in New Hampshire. This was the first official Democratic presidential primary of the election year. Senator Bernie Sanders narrowly defeats former South Bend, Indiana mayor Pete Buttigieg to win the primary.

February 13th, 2020 The U.S. Senate votes 55-45 to pass a measure requiring President Trump to win approval from Congress before taking further military actions against Iran.

By the time you have received this bulletin, I will be on my way to Washington D.C. for the 2020 Legislative Conference. I hope to bring back more information to include in my next bulletin.


National Vietnam War Veterans Day

If you are unsure which committee your hours belong to, just pick the one that makes the most sense. The most important thing is that hours are counted only one time for your department.
- Did you know you can earn hours bars working the Service to Veterans program? For more information on this, refer to the Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation brochure on the national website.

If you don't have the VA&R year end report form, please call or email me so I get it to you in plenty of time before reports are due May 15.
