Funeral services for Henry L. Hewitt, 69, prominent Elkton farmer, who died Friday in the Scheurer hospital, Pigeon, were conducted at 1:30 p.m. Monday in St. Paul's EUB church, Elkton. Rev. Ernest G. Bellella, Missionary Church, Elkton, officiated with burial in the Colfax cemetery, Bad Axe.

Mr. Hewitt was born June 2, 1898 in Oliver township. He was a well known Holstein cattle breeder as well as one of the leading dairy producers in Huron county. Hewitt's Holstein entries at the County Fair have dominated that phase of competition for many years.

Henry Hewitt and Martha Stahl were married December 3, 1919.
