Shout Broadband

A Shout Broadband internet user please email Michele at mmnewman6@juno.com with your Shout Broadband experience, good or bad. Your input will be shared with the community.

Shout Broadband has been asked not to place anymore business signs within NRE and they have said they will stop.

Also, Shout Broadband has said there may be the possibility of having miniature community towers. Each tower would service about 25 homes and back up the other towers in case one went down. Towers would provide an approximate down-speed of 50 for the same cost as Next Link's speed for 25, at around \$100 a month. This is still in the discussion stage and no written proposal has been received.

Dumpster Program

The program was another huge success for the third year. It was so popular that it required two dumpsters. The first one was delivered two days early and the second one was not picked up until two days beyond the scheduled pickup date.

There were far fewer issues this year compared to last year. For example, there were only two tires left this year. One of those had to be dug out of the dumpster and the other was left outside, although instructions were to not leave any tires. There was some kitchen trash on the ground outside the dumpster. There was some brush in the dumpster and it had to be removed, etc.

Some neighbors also helped make this year better. Buddy Andrews crushed the trash down in the dumpster several times with his front end loader to help make more space. The Marvell and Bade families took loads of metal to A&A for recycling.

Crime Watch

Potentially Dangerous Situation – An alert neighbor sent the following information and it was originally disseminated via email. On May 30, just before 8 PM, a black Cadillac drove into the Preakness Ct. cul-de-sac and spun out. Then it left at a very high rate of speed back towards Nolan River. This was repeated some 15 minutes later slide into the cul-de-sac and speed off down the road. This behavior is dangerous as there are many kids living on this street now. Not to mention the disturbance this causes on an otherwise peaceful night. If anyone knows where this black Cadillac belongs, please let them know it would be appreciated if they will slow down.
