


# Coronado Hills Neighborhood Monthly Newsletter



## INTRODUCING CHCRNA TASK FORCES

This past year, your **Coronado Hills/Creekside Neighborhood Association board** was completely new — and we spent 2025 getting our footing. We focused on meeting as many neighbors as possible, listening to what you want to see in our community, and learning how we can make the biggest impact together. Now, we're ready to put that feedback into action! We're launching **three new neighborhood task forces** to help guide our efforts in 2026:



- 1. Neighborhood Issues & City Relations** — Focused on 311 requests, code concerns, and broader City of Austin issues that impact our neighborhood.
- 2. Social & Community Connections** — Helps plan events, coordinate sponsors for *Neighbor of the Month*, welcome new neighbors, and highlight the people who make this community special.
- 3. Parks & Amenities** — Works with the City to bring new amenities to our neighborhood, with a 2026 goal of advocating for our first park.

Each group will meet as needed (likely about once a month) and will include at least one board member to report updates at our monthly neighborhood meetings.

We know everyone's plates are full — this isn't meant to add *another thing* to your to-do list. Think of it instead as a flexible way to plug in when you can, meet great people, and make a lasting difference right here at home.

If you've ever thought, "*I wish our neighborhood had \_\_\_\_\_*," this is your chance to help make it happen. 🌱

# YEAR IN REVIEW: 2025 CHCRNA WINS

As we look back on our first year together, we're incredibly grateful and so happy to celebrate everything we've accomplished as a community. From fun neighborhood gathering to advocating for changes with city officials, every little success is a testament to the amazing spirit of Coronado Hills.

**Diverse Monthly Events:** We hosted a variety of monthly events that brought neighbors together, including a neighborhood garden tour, a pop-up coffee shop, a holiday gathering, multiple Walk, Talk, and Tidy cleanups, a digital archive event, and get-togethers at local restaurants and bars.

**Neighbor of the Month Highlights:** We celebrated a "Neighbor of the Month," highlighting community members' contributions.

**Shared Streets Project Successes:** We advocated for improvements to the Shared Streets Project, resulting in new traffic signs and a uniform 25 mph speed limit.

**Archiving Neighborhood History:** We started digitizing physical archives to preserve the neighborhood's history for future generations.

**Supporting Local Schools:** We strengthened our bond with local schools by hosting a meet-up at a Northeast High School football game.

**Community Stand Initiative:** We created a community stand for sharing feedback, seeds, produce, and books, which has become a beloved neighborhood hub.

**Kept Our Neighborhood Clean:** Through our "Walk, Talk, and Tidy" cleanups, we removed over 100 pounds of waste from neighborhood streets.

**Strengthened City Connections:** We maintained and strengthened relationships with city officials, including code officers, our district APD liaison, our city council member, and other city representatives.

**Collaborative Neighborhood Survey:** We created a neighborhood survey that allowed us to hear from dozens of neighbors, making it easy to gather feedback and fostering a collaborative spirit within the association.

Looking ahead, we'd love to see even more neighbors join in to amplify what we can achieve together. That's why we've set up these task forces (see first page!)—so after a full year of advocacy, we're inviting you to add your voice and energy. Your participation can make all the difference!
