The cost this year is \$420.00 per week if paid in full by March 26th, \$470 per week after that. Again this year, there is a Multi-Scout Family Discount. Families with more than one scout attending camp with the troop pays the entire fee for Scout one; the entire fee less \$50 for each additional scout each week.

Health/medical form due to the troop by May 14th. The health/medical form is on the troop website, and must be less than one calendar year old for the entire time you are at camp. <u>The BSA has updated the Health/Medical Form this year, so make sure to download the most recent form from the Troop 78 website or from the Camp Horseshoe website</u>. Please make sure the completed health/medical form includes parts A, B & C (part C is a pre-participation physical and requires a physician's signature) with a front and back copy of your medical insurance card.
