Members Reports

May Pacific Dawn Trip

May was a very windy month up around the Channel Islands, and this day was no exception. After a bumpy ride out to Santa Rosa Skinny decided he was going to try fishing the front side of the island. This quickly changed as we got out from behind the island and we saw just how windy and unfishable the weather had become on that side.

From there we worked our way to the backside in hopes that we could hide behind the island and have some relief from the wind, but yet again this didn't work out. By now it was approximately 9:30am and we had yet to drop a line.

Finally, after a nice breakfast and some good conversation we reached a rock that Skinny decided to hold the boat on so we could get fishing. We proceeded to pick away at some pretty good grade reds and chucks with a lingcod or two mixed in for the next few hours.

After getting blown all over the place for some time we finally found a spot where they really wanted to bite. This drop produced a large number of the fish that we put on the boat this trip.

Being the jig fisherman that I am I dropped a 120z green and black Cribbs jig that got absolutely demolished by what I can only assume was a very large lingcod. The fish immediately dogged me and tried to run back to the rocks. Finally I was able to turn his head and get him headed in the right direction but about half way up he ripped line back down to the bottom. This happened two or three times before Skinny, thinking we were clear to move to another spot, pulled the boat forward. That is where it all fell apart. I didnt loosen on the fish as I should have and the hooks on the jig started to straighten so they pulled out of the fish's mouth. I was devastated and in fact Im still having flashbacks about it!

After recovering from my loss I fixed the hooks on that same jig and dropped it back down and got hammered again. This time I didn't play around and I got it up to the boat quickly! Finally a nice lingcod! The next few drops produced a couple more legal lings and some nice rockfish. We ended our trip with limits of good quality rockfish and 810 lingcod with the largest being my jackpot fish weighing in at about 9lbs.

Thank you to everyone who participated in this trip. It was rough and we had to work for every fish we
