#### The Reverend's Ruminations - August 2025

As August approaches and our schedules continue to feel over-committed, it can be hard to believe that 2/3 of Minnesota's "unofficial days of summer" have already come and gone. If you're like me, perhaps you were hoping to spend a little more of your July relaxing — whether near a campfire or tooling casually around our area lakes on a pontoon or in a kayak!?! Of course there's still time for some of those activities, but if you're like me, once the calendar turns over to August it can seem as though summer is all but slipping through our fingers. I hope that instead of panicking, you and your family have already been enjoying your favorite outdoor activities, whether those include the ball diamonds, boating, swimming, hiking, camping, gardening, playing outside, or just lounging in the shade with a cool drink. Ellen and I still have a short camping getaway planned in August, so I pray that the weather cooperates for all of us to safely enjoy whatever brings us fleeting summertime enjoyment.

If the remaining steamy summer days provide you with some extra moments available for reading, I challenge you to look ahead at our Bible passages for Sundays in August and beyond. Our epistle readings this month will include a final passage from the third chapter of **Colossians**, then examine the 11<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> chapters of **Hebrews**. Our gospel readings in August will be from **Luke**'s 12<sup>th</sup> – 14<sup>th</sup> chapters, but we will continue (as we have since mid-June) in Luke's gospel all the way until Advent begins on November 30<sup>th</sup>. [If you'd like to learn more about this important gospel, see my rightnow MEDIA review on the next page.] My Sunday sermons will also continue for a few more months from the Old Testament lectionary selections, including the 1<sup>st</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> chapters of **Isaiah**, followed then by several weeks examining **Jeremiah** in August, September, and part of October.

As you enjoy all the sunshine, warmth, community festivals, county and state fairs that August has to offer here in southern Minnesota, I pray that you look for God at work in the world around you. The breezes, lapping waves, singing birds, and even the rain remind us that God is still creating and blessing our world. Listen closely to the natural world around you, pause to be still as you take it all in, and open your mind to experience the peace that Christ offers in your life today, tomorrow, and always.

Our adult Sunday School participants ended up travelling or sick in July, so there is still opportunity for you to join in the two remaining sessions of our video discussion, **Navigating** with the Lord's Prayer. We will be meeting after worship on August 17 and September 21 in the chapel, and would love to have additional participants.

Sunday School and confirmation classes for our youth will also be resuming before you know it, so now is the time to check with relatives, friends, or neighbors who you think might enjoy being part of our faith formation opportunities at First Congregational UCC. Let the church office or a member of the Christian Education Board know if you have a new student who'd like to participate, and be watching both the church Facebook page and our church website for scheduling information.

See you soon as we join together to worship God at First Congregational United Church of Christ!




Last month, I encouraged you to explore Paul's short letter to the Colossians, but as summer rolls into fall, we will continue to hear gospel readings from Luke all the way through November. Luke is a great historian, and as a well-educated man of his time, he offers very detailed recollections of his time with Christ and the teachings our Savior shared. Whether you've read it in its entirety before or not, I encourage you to dig into **The Gospel of Luke: Part 1**:

Who is Jesus of Nazareth, and what does he ask of us? For help answering these questions, we can turn to Luke's orderly account of Jesus's life and ministry — the Gospel of Luke. In this elevensession series, pastor and author J.D. Greear will walk through the first half of Luke's Gospel, highlighting who Jesus is, what he did, and how the people around him responded. Luke shows us that Jesus is the savior who came to seek and save people in need, including us — and we must decide how to respond when lovingly moves toward us.

There are at least sixteen churches that I can think of off the top of my head within the city limits of Fairmont, with several rural churches nearby in the county and more in every small town around us. Each of these congregations is a little bit different in their worship style or the intricacies of their theological practices, but deep down we are all different "flavors" of Christianity. Rather than focus on our differences, have you ever paused to look at what makes us brothers and sisters in Christ? Take some time this month to explore the roots of your faith with **What Is a Christian?** 

Ask any group what it means to be a Christian, and we will hear different answers. But what unifies us? What are the basic characteristics of our faith that every Christian affirms? In this six-session series, Francis Chan will lead us in an exploration of key concepts common to all Christians through the centuries. No matter what divides us, we are united by these truths about the God we worship and our relationship with him.

# FIRST CONGREGATIONAL UCC FAIRMONT, MN CHURCH COUNCIL MINUTES FOR 7-16-25

Members Present: Dave Adams, Carol Barrick, Kay Campe, Cynthia Celander, Christina Hainy, Cindy Huset, Catherine Johnson, Sue Kruse, Larry Lasch, and Rebecca Lunz. Members Absent: Abby Shoen. Ex-officio Members Present: Pastor Cory. Ex-officio Members Absent: Dara Bliesmer, Asst. Treasurer.

The Council met in Heritage Hall at 5:45 PM. Moderator Kay Campe called the meeting to order, and Pastor Cory led in prayer.

Motion to approve the minutes from the meeting on 6/18/25, was M/S/C. (Larry Lasch/Catherine Johnson)

**Treasurer's Report** Catherine Johnson reported that 49% of the budget has been received by the end of June. Online giving year-to-date 2025 receipts are \$13,275 with total fees at \$37.47. The first meeting of the Investment Advisory Committee, with Dave Meschke and Cynthia Celander serving on it, will be at the end of July. A motion to receive the treasurer's report was M/S/C. (Carol Barrick/Larry Lasch)

**Pastor's Report:** Pastor Cory reported on his many activities for the month, including baptism of his grandsons and Legion Honor Guard for Sons of Union Veterans of the Civil War ceremony.

#### **BOARD REPORTS:**

**Christian Education:** No summer meetings, but Sunday school will begin on Sunday, September 14<sup>th</sup> right after the children's sermon during worship.

**Hospitality:** No meeting this month.

**Facilities:** Larry Lasch said that they are looking at the church's utility bills and are possibly purchasing three toilets (around \$200 each) for the basement restrooms.

**Diaconate:** No summer meetings.

**Mission:** Dave Adams reported that the June Blessing Box received \$510.34 for Shepherd's In. The July Blessing Box is for Heaven's Table Backpack Program. Pastor Cory talked to someone who regularly gets takeout meals from the Free Community Meals for shut-ins and elderly neighbors.

**Worship:** Cindy Huset told us that we have a baptism on July 20<sup>th</sup>, and they have been looking for pulpit supply for a few dates.

#### **COMMITTEE REPORTS:**

**Stewardship:** Amanda Forstrom is working on this. **Nominating:** Cynthia Celander is working on this.

**Personnel:** Nothing yet.

Creation Justice: Ace Adams is the contact. Nothing new.

**OLD BUSINESS:** Council goals for the year were discussed. (Including: working with St. John's UCC on a few events, Cookie Walk signup, a possible biscuit board fundraiser, Catherine Johnson leading Glows soup supper, Carol Barrick working on a new church directory, name tags, cribbage tournament, progressive dinner, Moon Dogs game.) One Counsellor and REM will be using the church on Fridays. We will be part of Worship by the Water, Sunday, August 10<sup>th</sup>, at 11 AM, in Ward Park. (No service at the church that day.)

**NEW BUSINESS:** We expect a check from Hy-Vee at some point. They had gotten behind on issuing checks for turning in receipts. Thank you, Jim Bock, for continuing this mission. We will have a Creation Justice Sunday on Sunday, August 24<sup>th</sup>. Casual clothing is encouraged as we will be working outside the church to weed, etc. after worship. A potluck will be held afterwards. A church display using written-on doors was discussed for installing outside the church.

#### Hy-Vee & Fareway Report as of Report as of 20 July 2025

Summer is a slow time for the slips coming in. As I look at the past two year, the amount of slips and the value was about the same as is listed below.

During the last 4 weeks, \$6,334.40 (3.17%) worth of Hy-Vee slips were received. After 32 weeks, Hy-Vee is at \$133,727.86 (66.86%) toward the 18<sup>th</sup> goal which is \$200,000 and maybe reached around the end of October 2025.

During the same time, \$1,095.11 (0.73%) worth of Fareway slips were received. After 119 weeks, Fareway is at \$129,070.08 (86.05%) toward our  $5^{th}$  \$150,000 goal. It could take 21 weeks to reach the  $5^{th}$  \$150,000 goal and maybe reached around the end of November 2025.

This program started the first of March 2011, so any slips from then until now can be used. Any Fairmont Fareway and Hy-Vee food store register slip or deliver pages can be used. Slips from Hy-Vee Fast & Fresh (Gas), Coffee Shop, Food Service, and Pharmacy help us toward the goal. Thanks to all who bring/mail the slips to the Church, or mailing them or dropping them off at my house. Even the very small amounts help.

#### **Lemon Ice**

from Mrs. H. J. Waite

Juice of 2 lemons

1 tsp lemon extract (scant)

1½ cup water

1¾ cup sugar

1½ cup rich cream

Whites of 2 eggs, beaten stiff

Mix lemon juice, extract, sugar & water.
Put in freezer. When it starts to chill, add
the beaten egg whites & cream. The
cream can be whipped. This makes seven
large dishes.



#### **Maple Mousse**

from Mrs. Herman Wehler (she became a member in 1917)

1 cup maple syrup 1 pt. cream whipped 4 eggs

Separate eggs, beat yolks well. Add to syrup.
Cook over water like custard. Boil until
thick. Cool. Whip cream. Beat egg whites
stiff. Stir cream into custard. Add whites.
Pack & freeze 4 hours Frigidaire.

#### **Apricot Ice Cream**

1 pt. sugar
1 pt. cream
1 pt. milk
1 qt. canned apricots
Juice of 1 lemon
2 egg whites

Put apricots through a sieve. Beat egg whites, mix & freeze.
