*** From the Pastor ***

"For who is God but the Lord?

And who is a rock, except our God?

The God who has girded me with strength has opened wide my path.

He has made my feet like the feet of the deer, and set me secure on the heights.

He has trained my hands for war, so that my arms can bend a bow of bronze.

You have given me the shield of your salvation, and your help has made me great. You have made me stride freely, and my feet do not slip;

II Samuel 22: 32-37



There was a school shooting today. Two children, 8 and 10, are dead. Fourteen more are hospitalized, with a range of injuries. They are expected to survive, as are the three women in their eighties, who were attending Mass with them. This shooting took place at a Roman Catholic school and church, Annunciation Catholic Church and School, as the children, teachers and staff were coming to Mass. The school and church are located on the south side of Minneapolis.

These school shootings are becoming all too common. But, there was a distinct difference in this one. The shooting took place while the victims, the rest of the school and some community members were praying! They were talking to God when their lives were forever changed. Evil confronted good. It might seem that evil won. We absolutely know that is not true, but the parents of those two dead children might have a hard time believing it, and I would not blame them. Today, their minds and hearts are probably not focused on the images of their children being greeted by their Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. They could be focused on the emptiness in their homes; on the absence of the physical presence of their children. To hear they and the other families affected by this are in our thoughts and prayers might provide little comfort.

I listened to the press conference late this afternoon, at which Governor Tim Walz, Minneapolis Police Chief Brian O'Hara, school principal Matthew DeBoer and the Archbishop of Minneapolis, Bernard Hebda, all spoke. The principal spoke about holding all these families in our prayers, and quoted an African proverb about prayer involving the moving of the feet; that image was reinforced by Archbishop Hebda. That image is why I chose the scripture passage at the beginning of this column. We as a church are prayer warriors. We take that weekly bulletin insert with the names of those needing prayer to heart. We spend time commending these people and their circumstances to God. The community of Annunciation Catholic Church will be added to that list tomorrow as we lift our prayers.

Prayer is always the best place to start, but it is not a place to end. The author of this passage from II Samuel knew that God was his shield and salvation. In his case, it was during war. He was given the feet of a deer to navigate the rough places, the places surrounded by treacherous terrain, and filled with enemies. He trusted God to bring him through that, as I am sure the people of Annunciation are trusting God to bring them through this tragedy. But rough places, treacherous terrain and enemies are not relegated to times of war. There are more than enough of them, here and now, that we as people of faith need to navigate. Please, this day, let God direct not only your words, but your feet.

In Jesus' name. Amen.


