- Only1 time of service
- Only 1 relationship and do not add any
- Must be signed by a Post Officer unless it is woman veterans joining on herself
- Half sheet transmittal both white and yellow copies
- Only list names that paid online, do not send any money for them.
- Make sure you mark all of the **NEW** women veterans.
- Do not mark NEW women veterans when they are renewing.

Please let your members know that if they pay online they need to let you know. Members can now also pay by phone using a credit/debit card. Call National at 1-317-569-4500 and tell them you want to pay your dues by phone. National will start sending out cards for the 2018-19 year until then they have to let you know. They can only pay the current years dues. If they owe 2017 or before they will pay 2018 first until January 1 and then they must pay 2019 to be current...this will be a rejoin member.

National Convention winners will be announced at Fall Conference.

Outdoor activities? Open Houses? Good Food? Assemblies or Programs? The 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary is an opportunity to continue the traditions that you have established in your area and a perfect opportunity to put yourself on the forefront in the minds of your community.

First, some history to add to your arsenal so that you can let everyone know at the drop of a hat who we are and what we do. The American Legion Auxiliary has been dedicated to serving veterans, military and their families for 100 years. Auxiliary members exemplify "Service Not Self" through countless volunteer hours, programs, children and youth and community service and an increased presence in Washington DC. Although many things have changed since our establishment in 1919, the one thing that remains the same is our unwavering commitment to honor those who serve.

The American Legion/Auxiliary was founded in March 1919 in Paris, France, by US. World War I military personnel stationed there who were dedicated to four pillars of service and advocacy: veterans, military personnel, children & youth and (Americanism) patriotic values. Today it consists of 55 "departments" in the 50 states as well as the District of Columbia, France, Mexico, the Philippines and Puerto Rico. Current national membership is over 2 million, with the combined Legion family over 3 million.

We will mark our 100<sup>th</sup> Anniversary with a 15-month celebration running from our national convention in August 2018 through Veterans Day 2019. The Anniversary mantra is "LEGACY AND VISION." Even after 100 years, ALA members remain steadfast in our commitment to service. The American Legion Family will continue serving our returning injured veterans and the caregivers who help them. We also continue to serve those who did not return home. We ensure that no one is left behind. We are celebrating past accomplishments as we renew the organizations vision to serve communities, states and the nation for a second century.

Remember: The American Legion Auxiliary is celebrating our anniversary for a reason. Let us focus on service with 20/20 vision as we celebrate this milestone and ring in a new century of supporting the American Legion Auxiliary mission – serving our veterans, service members, and their families – truly living our promise of "Service Not Self."

## Fun Ways to Celebrate the Centennial and Social Media Ideas

- 1. Add the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary logo to websites, social media, email, brochures, newsletters. Etc. The logos are available on the American Legion web site.
- 2. Send a letter to the editor of your local newspaper. A sample of letter available in tool kit.
- 3. Interview a local businessman about your community and are they a member? Publicize.
- 4. Create a short video for YouTube or your website, Facebook, blog or social media.
- 5. Think about the contributions that your Post/Unit has made to your community. Write an article or press release about what it has meant to the area. Work with media to feature regular stories.
- 6. Set up a table at local farmers markets with giveaways and information about our organization.
- 7. Hold a Food Truck event with a theme of supporting our veterans.
- 8. Movie night: Project a movie outside or in your post featuring veterans.
- 9. Hold an Oral History Project in schools with prizes for participants.
- 10. Increase awareness of the Centennial by creating fliers about our history with photos and stories. Post throughout the community.
- 11. Create a Hall of Fame in your Post with pictures and stories of all.
- 12. Stage a "flashback Friday" of stories that were significant to your post/unit.
- 13. Schedule a presentation of Centennial Celebration for County, School and Community Boards.
- 14. Invite State Legislators to Centennial events. Get pictures with them at these events and share on websites, in newsletters, etc.
- 15. Work with your Chamber of Commerce to host a meeting or speak at one of their meetings to talk about the Centennial and events to be held.
- 16. Hold a scrapbook contest or photo memory page as part of the celebration with prizes for different age groups.

- 17. Honor those who have the most continuous service to the organization. It can be a Tea, evening event or dinner/dance. Honor your "oldest, living member." It can be a simple punch and cookies event.
- 18. Honor current volunteers who steadfastly show up whenever needed.
- 19. Ask each unit in your district when they were organized. Which unit has the longest, continuous activities?
- 20. Plant trees in honor of the Centennial.
- 21. Display a sign or banner at the entrance to the city AND outside your Post home.
- 22. Hold an Ice Cream Social at you Post Home and invite children to celebrate the 100<sup>th</sup> Birthday.
- 23. Develop weekly "radio spots" for your local station of historical value.
- 24. Consider sponsoring a scavenger hunt throughout the post and grounds with a map and patriotic findings to vie for prizes.
- 25. Challenge volunteers to give 100 hours of service to celebrate.
- 26. Honor families with two or more generations still active in the Post/Unit.
- 27. Create a time capsule with anniversary items on our Post grounds.
- 28. Host a contest for high school students to create a short video about veterans.
- 29. Host an essay contest for middle and high school students about what life would be without the freedoms that we enjoy.
- 30. Ask members to donate \$100 in honor of the Centennial. Place names on special plaque.
- 31. Create a living history of members and post items from the past.
- 32. Perform a skit or short play about the history of our organization. Go into the community with this and have fun.
- 33. Plant a Centennial Garden.

- 34. Create a Centennial Christmas Tree with 1919-era ornaments for your holiday activities.
- 35. Host a Centennial Tea Party with authentic food and stories from the past.
- 36. Create a Centennial Calendar and plan one activity each month that marks the celebration.
- 37. Partner with local museums/businesses to create a Centennial Display.
- 38. Host a Centennial booth at a local Farmers Market.
- 39. Create a Centennial Scrapbook. Compete for Department Awards.
- 40. Sponsor a Membership Drive to ensure our existence in the next 100 years.
- 41. Rent a billboard with participating units to advertise our 100<sup>th</sup> birthday.

#### October 2018

Greetings Ladies,

Wow, a lot has happened since the last update. So many things have been going on.

The end of July was busy. On 7/23/18, the U.S. Senate confirmed Robert Wilkie as the 10<sup>th</sup> Secretary of the Department of Veterans Affairs. On 7/24/18, President Trump spoke at the VFW National Convention in Kansas City, MO.

August was even busier. On 8/8/18, a dog tag from Korean War Veteran, Master Sgt. Charles H. McDaniel, a U.S. Army Medic was given to his surviving sons. On 8/22/18, a Medal of Honor was presented to family of deceased veteran Sgt. John Chapman, killed in Afghanistan in 2002. On 8/25/18, Senator John S. McCain III passed away at 1628 hours. Senator lied in state at the Arizona State Capitol on 8/29/18. His Arizona funeral was held in Phoenix on 8/30/18. I was privileged to be a part of his farewell with my law enforcement brothers and sisters in uniform. Senator McCain then lied in state at the U.S. Capitol on 8/31/18. Funeral at National Cathedral in D.C. was held on 9/1/18, with a private burial at Annapolis, Maryland on 9/2/18. On 9/4/18, Governor Doug Ducey announced Former Senator Jon Kyl as McCain's replacement to finish this Congressional Session which ends in December. The Arizona Primary Election was held on 8/28/18. Governor Ducey won the Republican nomination. David Garcia won the Democrat nomination. The General election is on November 6, 2018. Kyrsten Sinema and Martha McSally are running against each other for Senator Jeff Flake's seat. On 8/30/18, Vice President Mike Pence addressed the American Legion National Convention in Minneapolis, MN. In his address, he honored Senator McCain.

As of September 4<sup>th</sup>, Judge Brett Kavanaugh whom was appointed by President Trump to replace Justice Anthony Kennedy, was still in confirmation hearings.

On September 11<sup>th</sup>, there were remembrance ceremonies throughout the state & nation.

September 21st is POW/MIA Recognition Day, with ceremonies throughout the state & nation.

Reminder, Election Day in the General Election is Tuesday November 6<sup>th</sup>, 2018.

The Federal Emergency Management Agency has developed a program to prepare citizens for emergency response. FEMA's Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) Program educates community members on disaster preparedness. Training is offered on four topics: fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization and disaster medical operations. Once trained, CERT members can assist their communities in preparing for and responding to emergencies. Training in community emergency response is a great way for member to great opportunity for a unit to organize members to train together.

#### **Register For A CERT Training:**

- 2. You will be redirected to a page where you can input your zip code. This page will produce a list of CERT programs near you.

- 4. Contact the designated individual to register and begin training.

Mary Ellen was born in Pepperell, Massachusetts. Mary Ellen enlisted in the U.S. Navy in 1950, served as a Yeoman to Admiral Hyman Rickover. Mary Ellen raised seven children. She relocated to AZ in 1985. Mary Ellen was Past Department Commander in 2000-2001. Mary Ellen was a member of TAL Post 94 in Sun City West which renamed the Post after her death in 2006 to Mary Ellen Piotrowski Post 94. Gerry is Past Commander of TAL Mary Ellen Piotrowski Post 94 in Sun City West. Gerry promotes Post 94's Pancake Breakfast fundraisers and the memorial Boulevard of Flags event, seven times each year, as well as participates in "honors" at the National Memorial Cemetery of Arizona. Gerry has helped over 400 domestic abuse survivors; helped raise over \$20,000 to assist disabled veterans in the west valley, supports the Joe Foss Institute and the Annual Maricopa County Stand Down. Gerry was inducted into the Arizona Veterans Hall of fame in 2016. Gerry is Vice President of the Arizona Veterans Hall of Fame Society.

**Joan Sisco** was born in Lake, Michigan and enlisted in the USMC and discharged as Sergeant. Joan is the founder/CEO Veterans First, Ltd. (Mary Ellen's Place) in Phoenix enhancing the lives of veterans, their families and caregivers. She works the issues of homeless veterans and their families with numerous shelters and government agencies, including the issues of homeless women veterans. Joan was inducted into the Arizona Veterans Hall of Fame in 2009 and is a member of TAL Christopher J. Lapka Post and Unit 105.

#### **Visually Impaired Veterans**

#### I BELIEVE

Visual impairment is a very serious problem, but I hope your Units can have a little fun working toward raising funds. Have a blind dinner by serving a meal (no hamburgers or hotdogs, maybe spaghetti or something else really messy) to blindfolded participants. (Have plastic tablecloths and bibs!) Hand out lined paper and pencils during your meeting and have the members close their eyes and write "I believe equality exists serving every visually impaired veteran." Play "pin the tail" by blindfolding members to let them experience the disorientation of vision loss. Only be creative, play "pin the stinger on the bee." Or use your own imagination to invent a game using blindfolds. But be safe; don't be stumbling around the room blindfolded. The idea is to experience in a very small way, the trials of vision loss.

Each time I speak to a group about PSP, I am supported by people who have themselves experienced vision loss or are coping with a loved one who has. Let those members explain the challenges involved. This is something we all can relate to.


