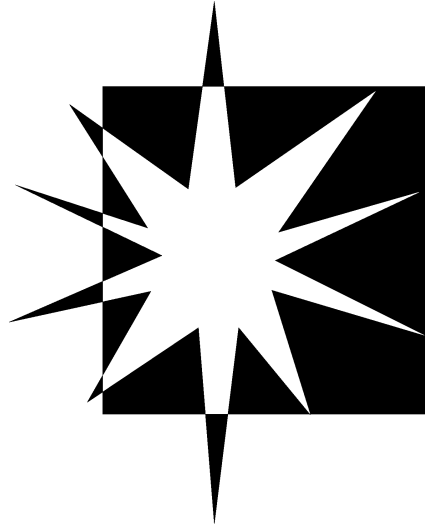

Grace & Peace
from the Pastor's Desk

Psalm 16:11 *“You will show me the path of life; in Your presence is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures forevermore.”*

As we enter the month of February we often think of Valentines’ Day and red hearts. That is a heartfelt time of romantic love for some people, just another day for some people, but for others it can be a day of heartache as feelings of loneliness engulf them. Feelings of loneliness can touch anyone at some time in their lives, so how do we cope with those feelings?

There’s always the tried-and-true methods of phone calls to friends and loved ones. Writing a letter or sending a card can also ease the sense of loneliness. You

may not receive a response but just the effort of writing helps a person to feel connected to another. And you will make the day of the person who receives your correspondence.

If you’re physically able it’s always good to move. You can exercise by walking, taking a class, or swimming at the Y if you have a membership. (Silver sneakers is a commonly available insurance perk allowing a reduced cost or possibly free membership.)

Then there’s laughter. It may be that you really don’t feel like you want to laugh, but laughter raises the endorphin levels of the body. That means that it makes your brain happy. It also relaxes your entire body, boosts your immune system, increases blood flow which leads to less of a risk of heart attacks. Laughter really helps you to feel better and makes for a healthier life.

If none of these appeal to you why not try listening to music? A study done in 2023 by Kiernan & Davidson, published in International Journal of Environmental Research and Public Health suggests that listening to music can help with loneliness by giving a person a sense of control and identity. Your choice of music is up to you, but what is better than listening to hymns? They can be easily found on youtube.com, or you may have a CD or possibly even a record player on which you can listen to your favorite hymns.

And of course, there is always reading the Psalms. The Psalms sing out to God from the fullness of all emotions. There is anger, loneliness, heartbreak, every emotion is expressed by the psalmist. And it is all directed to God knowing that God is everlasting and ever-present.

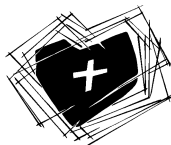

It will be in the lounge after church service. The Eckmans will be hosting.

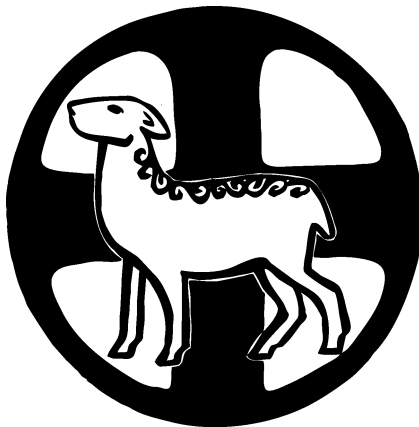

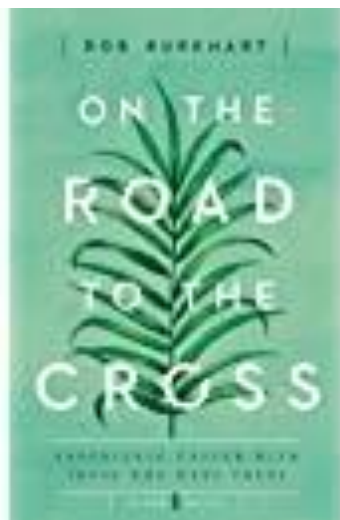

Using his imagination Rob Burkhart creates scenes that could be interactions of the lesser-known biblical characters who interact



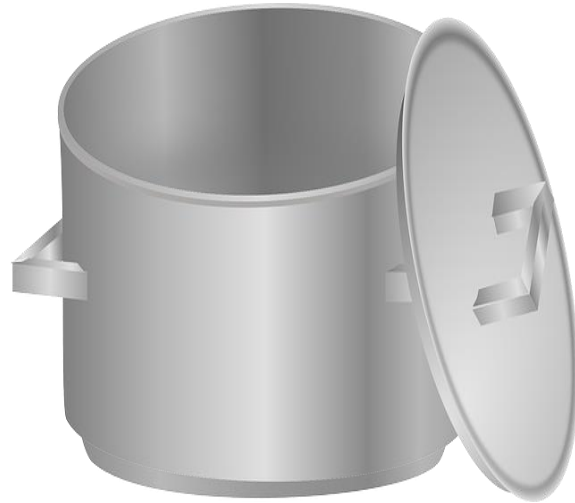

### CREATION-FRIENDLY CLOTHING TIPS

Do you know what clothing materials are most eco-friendly? Organic cotton is rated tops! Organic cotton cuts out the harmful synthetic chemicals used to grow conventional cotton, making for safer working conditions for farmers and a healthier planet.

Other sustainable fabrics are made from plant-based materials like hemp (low impact crop that requires much less water than conventional cotton), Tencel Lyocell (made from recycled wood pulp fiber & is very soft).

Some innovative eco-friendly materials are Lenzing Modal (soft material made from fast-growing beech trees), Pinatex (made from pineapple leaf waste), mushroom-based leather, plant-based faux fur, and recycled wool.

Innovative indigo foam-dyeing cuts nearly all wastewater out of the jeans-making process while reducing the carbon impact of coloration and water usage. Natural buttons can be made from tagua palm nuts gathered from the forest floor – great alternative to plastic.

Here are some tips:

- Care label symbols show the maximum treatment. Try washing at lower temperatures than indicated on the label.
- Using too much detergent may not necessarily result in cleaner laundry, but has an unnecessary impact on the environment. Try an eco-friendly detergent such as Earth Breeze; its liquidless detergent sheets are biodegradable.
- Reduce the number of times you wash your garments. Remove stains manually, and air clothes to freshen up after each use. Wash full loads of laundry, in cold water when possible. To save energy dry them the old-fashioned way – outdoors on a clothesline!
- By optimizing garment care and use, you can actively help to reduce your carbon footprint.

Look for companies that focus on sustainability even in their supply chain. Here are some examples:

- [Outerknown.com](http://Outerknown.com) – the first brand founded on a total commitment to sustainability. Their hallmarks are purposeful design, responsible sourcing, Fair Labor practices. Their S.E.A. jeans are guaranteed for life
- [Patagonia.com](http://Patagonia.com) outdoor clothing - makes functional, durable and repairable clothing. Its website includes “worn wear.” Make a bit of cash by trading your gear in to live again.
- [HappyEarthApparel.com](http://HappyEarthApparel.com) uses organic cotton and recycled fibers and no-plastic packaging
- [Organicbasics.com](http://Organicbasics.com)
- Mate [Matethelabel.com](http://Matethelabel.com) – organic essentials; uses only organic and non-toxic material.
- Pact Apparel ([wearpact.com](http://wearpact.com)) – garments only use organic cotton

Earth-friendly certifications to look for:

- GOTS – Global Organic Textile Standard – at least 70% certified organic fibers
- Fair Trade Certified – clothes have been produced meeting strict economic, environmental & social standards, including working conditions, funding for community development, etc.
- Standard 100 by OEKO-TEX – certified harmless for human health
- Bluesign – made by using resources responsibly, with sustainable chemistry, creating minimal impact on people & environment.

## Green Tip SWPA Synod Green Team

Do you tend to purchase more than you need or sometimes make impulse purchases? Then you find that you need to dispose of those unneeded or unwanted items?

When you need to return an item of clothing you bought online, do you imagine it is handled with care and eventually sold to someone else? Unfortunately, much of what is sent back gets sent to landfills. Before you buy, take your measurements, use the size charts, and rely on customer reviews. **Before you return anything**, check with friends, perhaps they would add the piece to their wardrobe.

According to one source, 146 million tons of solid waste goes to landfills in the U.S. every year. Located in "someone else's backyard," landfills are notorious for environmental injustice and for methane, which contributes to global warming.

Please try to **donate, rehome, or recycle instead of trashing.**
