



Parent FAQ



Most parents have a lot of questions when it comes to letting their child LARP for the first time. We have outlined several of the most common questions below. If you would like more information please email us at prolarp.gm@gmail.com

Q. Could my child get hurt while LARPing?

A. Larping is just like playing a sport, and with any sport there is a chance for injury. The most common injuries are sprains, strains and twists. We have trained staff on-site ready to handle these types of injuries. Should additional medical attention be necessary, our camp site is less than 15 miles from the nearest hospital. Should your child need medical attention, you will be notified immediately via the contact info provided on the medical release form.



Q. Who plays NERO?

A. There are many different kinds of NERO players. We have players who are high school and college students, teachers, nurses, engineers, doctors, ministers, and everything in between. The majority of our core staff are adult professionals, many of which also have children.



Q. Can I come and watch?

A. Absolutely! We encourage parents to come watch and even adventure with their children. We want you to be sure that your child feels safe and comfortable with their surroundings.

Q. How can my child benefit from LARP?

A. There are many social and physical benefits to LARP. Larping is great exercise for the body as there is a lot of running any physical combat (please note that there is no body contact or fist-fighting). Larping is also great for the mind. Players often must work together to solve challenging puzzles in order to complete tasks. This also promotes social interaction with others. We have found that many LARPer attribute their real-life confidence, along with many other skills, to the experiences they've had while LARPing.



Q. Will my child have access to drugs or alcohol?

A. Absolutely NOT! Any kind of drugs or alcohol are strictly prohibited at NERO events. They are also prohibited by the campsite. ANYONE found to be in possession or under the influence of drugs or alcohol will be removed from site immediately. Local law enforcement will be contacted if necessary.

Q. Will my child be able to leave the site?

A. Players do leave early from the events for various reasons. All minors must remain on-site unless they have permission to leave from a parent or legal guardian. Parents should note on the release form who their child has permission to leave site with.

Q. How old does my child need to be in order to play NERO?

A. PRO requires all players to be at least 14 years of age.
