JR Mineral Reports

Aragonite of Morocco by Ahziah, age 6

• Aragonite is usually white, but it may be red, yellow, orange, green, purple, gray, brown, or blue. It's found in caves and around hot springs. In damp caves, aragonite crystals can make flower-like shapes. They form when dripping water contains calcium and carbon.

• I found this information in my "Rock Explorer" Minerals book.

• It is sometimes called sputnik cluster because it looks similar to the first manmade satellite in space.

• Argonite is a calcium carbonate mineral with a hardness of 3.5-4. If Aragonite contains sand, it gives the rock a brown color. I got this information off of wikipedia.com

JR Mineral Reports continued

Cobalto Calcite, by Justine, age 7

• Lepka cobalto calcite is a mineral in the carbonares class named after its chemical make-up of cobalt and carbonare. It has pretty colors or a deep rose red to pink. On the hardness scale it is a 4.

• I'm very happy to add this mineral to my collection.

Calcite by Sawyer, age 9

• Calcite crystals occur in a variety of forms, including hexagonal or trigonal, or often resulting as a rhombohedron. It exhibits double refraction (an object viewed through the crystal appears as a double image). White calcite crystals often form attached to other crystals such as amethyst, citrine, and fluorite.

• Various forms of calcite may be found throughout the world including the U.S. Brazil, China, or like this one they can be found in Mexico.

• They are very powerful energy amplifiers, helping to raise the energy level of your space. The chemical formula is CaCO3 it has a hardness range of 3 and its color is mostly white.

• Calcite is light colored and is either pointed or blocky.
