#### **Blessing Bag Project**

During the month of January, the church will focus on filling 50 Blessing Bags as a community outreach project. The primary ingredients will be food items: breakfast bars, cereal bars, granola bars, protein bars, peanut butter and cheese crackers, single packaged nuts and trail mix, Vienna sausages and foil tuna packs, (not requiring a can opener). We will begin taking donations next Sunday, January 7th. See the Blessing Bag display in the narthex for examples of items to fill the Blessing Bags.

#### **Food Bank News**

We are going to begin having a monthly product focus to help everyone participate in providing for the food bank's "urgent needs." For January, the "urgent need" is peanut butter. Please help! This year we have had \$19,000 in donations, and \$7,115.00 of that was from Bethany Lutheran. That is around 38 percent from Bethany Lutheran! Wow! We are serving 1,000-1,200 individuals or approximately 350 families per month. Each family is receiving 36-48 pounds of food, which is a goodly amount compared to most food banks. We are handing out about 15,000 pounds of food per month. We lost a major benefactor (12K per year), but we did pick up a new one - a warehouse that gives us 1-2 pallets of food weekly. We are struggling with our homeless clients. They are wasting a considerable amount of food. Last year a Thrivent Action Team from Bethany made up 25 bags specifically tailored for our homeless clients. It was appreciated by all involved with the food bank. Starting in the new year, we will institute a plan that is more specific for the homeless. We had \$312,000 worth of volunteer labor hours last year. God bless our volunteers! We need them and appreciate them. And God bless our congregation members that so faithfully donate food and money to one of our most valued ministries!
