Texas has experienced some very unusual temperatures. The heat has been devastating for our neighbors, pets, and homes. We continually hear about devastating fires happening all around country. It has taken its toll on our lawns, therefore everything is dry and the grass is like walking on dry hay. We are blessed to have some larger lots than some neighborhoods, but a grass fire can turn very quickly into a burning infernal.

Please keep these things in mind:

- 4. Motorcycles and vehicle mufflers are very hot, please do not park on the lawn.
- 5. We are still hearing popping sounds, we pray that it's not gunfire, and would be horrified to think someone is still popping fireworks around all this dry grass.
- 6. Gas generators are very dangerous at this time, and unless you are a contractor, why would anyone need one.

While speeding, 'might' get you somewhere faster, it is a 'sure' way to get someone killed. Speeding on Coronado Hills Dr. and throughout our neighborhood has been a concern that we have been trying to address. It has become a *major* issue lately. THE CHCRNA-AISD SCHOOL BUS PLAN EN-TERING ITS 15[™] YEAR!



We requested a reduction in the number of school buses that travel through our neighborhood, and especially those

buses that use our Berkman/Coronado Hills intersection, to leave from and return to, the Nelsen Field bus terminal, thus reducing school bus traffic and noise level.

In 2008, Yuri Prentice and Bonnie Turek met with the Director of AISD Transportation Dept., and the AISD Safety Officer, to formulate a plan to redirect school bus traffic to exit via Reagan Hill Dr., St. Johns Ave., Athletic Dr., the 290 Frontage Rd. and return to the terminal only via Cameron Rd., or the Frontage Road of 183 to 290. No AISD buses are to enter or exit our neighborhood via Creekside.

AISD has been very cooperative in gradually reducing their general bus traffic thru the Berkman/C.Hills intersection, from 180 daily bus trips in 2008, to ZERO buses, this Fall. However, there are 8 buses that provide transportation for our neighborhood children, to several schools.

We will have more information about those bus numbers, the Clifton buses and non AISD buses that use our streets, in next month's Newsletter.

MAKING SURE CITY STREETS ARE SMOOTH SAILING

As stated in the city of Austin's utility bill information sheet, it's the time of the year when city crews make repairs to the city streets with a smoothing process called 'sealcoat'. **We will receive advance notice of scheduled work.** Residents will be asked to move vehicles away from streets scheduled for maintenance for 2 days. Residents can expect loose gravel to settle in roughly 4 to 6 weeks. If you 'store' vehicles on the streets, this might be a good time to make arrangements to get it moved, donated, or sold. If you plan on 'storing' the vehicle in your driveway, there are City Code regulations that you must abide by.



GRAVEL MOUND IN THE NEIGHBORHOOD

Perhaps you may have noticed a giant gravel mound at the deadend at Glenhill Dr. and Berkman.

A call to 311, to City Transportation, then to the Public Works Dept. said the plan so far, looks like they plan on resurfacing Berkman from 51st to 290. No date given for starting this process.
