Drive By History

- 4. Veteran's Memorial** – 10 Harbor Lane – Freedom Pavilion
- 5. Lemon Bay Funeral Home** – 2 Buchan Landing – Originally Tate's Market
Built in the 1930's
- 6. Buchan's Landing & Home** – Built 1918 - End of Old Englewood Road at Dearborn Street - Where Boats brought goods before there were drivable roads.
- 7. Indian Mound Park** – 210 Winson Avenue off Green Street – History of Indian burial grounds & picnic area
- 8. Sculpture Garden** – 400 W. Green Street – sculpture created by local artists
- 10. Englewood Rec Center** -101 Orange Street – Rec Center, Play Ground and home to the Chalkfest.
- 11. Mango Bistro** – 301 W. Dearborn Street – Originally in 1940's Aston's electric Store, 1970's The Bargain Box and 2008 Mango's Bistro
- 12. Lemon Bay Woman's Club** – Built 1925 – 51 N. Maple Street
Historic woman's club – 1st building in Englewood to be on the U.S. National Register of Historic Places.
- 13. Kelly's Tavern** – 232 W. Dearborn Street – Originally the 1st floor housed the horses with the living quarters above. It was a barber shop, now as inn.
- 14. Old Englewood Appliance** – 80 W. McCall – In 1950's was the Pastry Shop. Refurbish used appliances like new.
- 15. Englewood Art Center Ringling** – 350 S. McCall Road – Division of Ringling Collage of Arts & Design – Non-Profit independent College
- 16. Old Englewood Cemetery** – Indiana Avenue (776) at 2nd Avenue. Many of Englewood original settlers and their descendents are buried here.
- 17. Green Street Church** – Next to Cemetery – 580 S. Indiana Ave.
Built in 1928 as Methodist Church on Magnolia Street. Later moved to Green Street, now in it's forever home next to the cemetery.
- 19. Cookie House** – 2300 Placida Road – (NOT ON MAP)
located at Cedar Point Environmental Park, Across from Lemon Bay High School Built 1931 by John Foster Bass, Jr – founder of Bass Biological laboratory
