Mexican Corn Bread Chef Unknown

Instructions:

- 2 Pkg (8 ½ ounces each) corn bread/muffin mix (I used Jiffy mix)
- 1 medium onion chopped
- 2 cups (8 oz) shredded cheddar cheese
- 1 can (14 3/4 oz) cream style corn
- 1 ½ cups (12 oz) sour cream
- 4 eggs beaten
- 1 can (4 oz) chopped green chilies
- 1/3 cup vegetable oil
- 1 tablespoon finely chopped jalapeno pepper optional (Chef does not use)

In a bowl, combine corn bread mix and onion. Combine remaining ingredients; add to the corn bread mixture just until moistened.

Pour into a greased 12X9X2 baking dish or baking pan. Bake at 350 degrees for 50 – 55 minutes or until lightly browned and the edges pull away from sides of pan.

Serve warm. Refrigerate leftover.

Yield 18 to 24 servings
