Pastor's Study

Dear St Anthony & St Pius Families,

4th Sunday of Advent

Matthew 1:18-24

that old nursery rhyme, describing the normal order of events of courtship, marriage and childbirth for new families! Yet, we hear of steps two and three, being switched in places for Joseph and Mary, with today's gospel. Mary is 'found with child' before Joseph and Mary have completed their 'engagement' period. Joseph has a dilemma: He loves his fiancé Mary, yet he loves the Law of Moses too. Matthew 1:19 describes Joseph as a 'righteous man', which means he was a devout disciple of Mosaic law, observing its every detail. The Law of Moses didn't allow such a 'masking' of an indiscretion (obviously, *child-making* occurred outside of marriage), yet Joseph also sensed the innate purity and goodness of Mary. So, Joseph decides to back out of the final marriage ceremony, but to do it without attention, so as, to preserve Mary's place in society (spare her a public shunning), and her reputation (we know of Mary's purity/grace) and possibly her life (*if adultery charges were pursued by the Mosaic Taliban, then Dt 22:21–23 called for death by stoning!*). Matthew 1:19 says Joseph decides to 'dismiss Mary quietly'. I suspect that while Jospeh is not willing to go through a 'public marriage ceremony with Mary' (avoid the duplicity involved in such a show), that still his compassion moves him to make family arrangements for Mary to live and be provided for safely by relatives. Think of how Mary in the gospel of Luke 1:39-45, will seek to live with and help her kinswoman Elizabeth for a period of time - or find refuge for herself. So Joseph's considerate goodness & his prayerful discernment propose a mutually helpful solution to his dilemma

UNTIL, God hosts the true 'REVEAL' party in this marital arrangement and sends an angel to Joseph in a dream to let Joseph know this '3'd' person in their marriage is God Himself! Joseph learns the true godly solution to this dilemma: Accept Mary & Child and be the best father and husband to God's choice for him! God lets Joseph know that while he may have come up with a good idea to take care of a problem, his idea was not God's idea and it wasn't for the greatest good. The child may not be Joseph's, but if salvation is to come to Joseph, it will be through Joseph's assumption of this humble role accepting, blessing and fostering this 'holy child' of God with Mary (Matt 1:20). Joseph follows through obediently and receives Mary publicly in marriage, taking her and her child into his home. This is Joseph's 'Yes' to God's Will, which is similar to Luke's account of Mary's 'Yes' to God at the Annunciation event (Luke 1:34-38). The angel knows of Joseph's deep devotion to God's word, so he invites Joseph to consider and pray over the prophecy of Isaiah 7:11 about a divinely commissioned and virginally-born son who is sent to 'save his people'. As a devout believer, Joseph would be familiar with many scriptural stories of God's interventions into the course of human events. Joseph is aware that God intervenes in the lives of His people all the time. Yet, this time God is intervening directly in Joseph's life. It takes great faith to accept that God is working in our lives, especially when it happens unexpectedly and contrary to the 'normal, expected course'. In a poem of William Everson, he says, 'God writes straight. My crooked lines...' (Himself an unexpected spiritual poet!)

Sometimes we think, we know best, yet God surprises us with even more, of we trust. We may come up with great ideas, but if they are not ideas in sync with God's plan, they are not best (more importantly, not God's, so they are not going anywhere really). **But how do we know, if something we come up with is in conformity with God's will?** Joseph and Mary both exhibit an openness to God through their faith practices: scripture reflection and prayer, good counsel with others and a consistent practice of faith with devout works of mercy/charity.

Or more specifically, a couple of years ago, I ran across a good checklist to use, when we wish to discern whether the hand of God, or not, is behind a particular plan of action we feel moved to perform. Of course, such famous spiritual directors like St Ignatius of Loyola or Jean Pierre de Caussade also provide helpful reading about discerning the Holy Spirit of God's movements. But I ran across a document written in 2014 by the Vatican Intl Theological Commission, submitted to the CDF and authorized for publication by the Vatican CDF. It was a work inspired by Pope Francis' call for 'closer listening' to the Holy Spirit in the lives of the Catholic faithful. It outlined qualities that dispose a person best to 'hearing and understanding' God's will in a particular situation. (# 88-105). The conditions which best support hearing God speak to direct us, include a) Participation in the life of the Church, b) Listening to the word of God, c) openness to reason, d) Adherence to the magisterium, e) Holiness – humility, freedom and joy, and f) Seeking the edification of the Church. These intentions and practices are all signposts to keep us on God's path, leading us in His Will and His Way! Something to pray about! Fr Brian
