Essential Functions

- Meet monthly with the rector to plan the liturgical year: including worship music, anthems and instrumentalists.
- Provide musical leadership for congregational singing, including playing the organ and piano at our 9:00 Sunday service (and an additional service if required), as well as for special services throughout the liturgical year (Ash Wednesday, Holy Week, Christmas Eve and Day). Right of first refusal for weddings and funerals (extra fees paid by the families).
- In anticipation of rebuilding a choir program, be willing to rehearse an adult choir for service music throughout the year; invite, coach, and encourage new members.
- Ensure proper maintenance of the pipe organ and piano, scheduling tuning/repairs.
- Ensure licensing is up to date and copyright information is properly noted in worship bulletins.
- Make use of all communication vehicles available (i.e., website, weekly parish news, parish Facebook page) to promote Annunciation's music and worship.
- Maintain music library files in the choir room.
- Submit budget information to church leadership annually and work within the established music department budget.

Core competencies

Musicianship: Proficiency in playing the organ and piano, teaching and rehearsing the choir, and working with instrumentalists. Knowledge of a wide variety of music.

Leadership: Inspires confidence in others, knows music and liturgy and how to teach, brings out the best in people, draws on all the resources available, and asks for help when appropriate
