All dogs must be confined, and the City does enforce a leash law. Dogs 6 months of age or older must be tagged with the City, including house dogs. Proof of current rabies vaccination is required to purchase a City tag. New residents must register their pets within 30 days of moving into the City

Limits. All dogs must be tagged annually on or before March

CITY TAGS

\$2.00—spay/neutered \$4.00—intact \$10.00—kennel fee

KENNEL FEE

Residents with 3 or more dogs are required to purchase a kennel fee in addition to City tags

—Dog Tag Clinic —



As a courtesy to our residents, the City schedules a dog tag clinic each March, which is held in the meeting room of City Hall. Local Veterinarians are on hand to offer canine rabies vaccinations, and combination vaccinations of distemper/parvo/rabies. This affords you the opportunity to obtain needed vaccinations, and purchase City Dog Tags in one convenient stop.

Establishing Utility Service in Moran

Utilities include electric, water, sewer and refuse, and may be established by paying a <u>NON-REFUNDABLE</u> connect fee of \$100.00 to the City. This fee is set by City Code and may be waived only if the applicant has paid a connect fee within the past five years from application date and left the City in good standing with account balances paid in full.

Landlords will provide tenants with a Landlord/Tenant agreement in which both the landlord and tenant's signatures must be notarized, a service provided free of charge at City Hall. This agreement gives the landlord's permission for the City to establish utilities at a specific address in the tenant's name. Tenants must bring the agreement to City Hall with their connect fees in order to establish their utility account.

Tenants will need a current, legitimate mailing address to establish a utility contract with the City. Failure to provide a current address will result in denial of utility service.

Utility Billing

Utility bills are mailed on the 10th of each month; payments are due by the 25th. If the 25th fall on a weekend, or holiday, payment is due the next business day.

- Accounts unpaid after the 25th are assessed a 10% penalty
- Amount due, plus penalty shall be due by the 30th of each month (except February when amount shall be due by the last day of the month). Unpaid accounts as of 30th are disconnected for non-payment
- Total balance plus penalties must be paid in full, along with a reconnect fee of \$75 per utility, to re-establish utility service

These dates are listed just above the return portion on all utility bills and serves as your reminder.

Please Note: The City does not mail out late notices.



Utility meters are read on the 30th of each month. The City requires each residence to provide direct, easy and safe access to all utility meters. Residents with meters within fenced yards must ensure that ALL gates on the property are unlocked to allow readers access through the gate closest to utility meters.

To ensure the safety of our readers, they will not enter yards with unchained dogs, or dogs chained too closely to utility meters.

If the reader feels threatened in any way, your meter will not be read and your utility bill will be estimated.

Customers do have the option of qualifying for the all-electric rate. Landowner must contact Kansas Gas Service (KGS) to disconnect gas service and also request KGS to remove gas meter from the property. Upon completion of these steps, landowner will need to contact City Hall to request their property be inspected. City Superintendent will inspect residence, and upon ensuring gas meter has been removed, will then approve the request. At that point the City Clerk's Office will make necessary changes to the utility rates for your account.

REFUSE

- Trash service is provided by Green Environmental Services, the cost of which is included on your utility bill. Pick-up is on Tuesdays, please set bins as close to the street as possible, by 6:00 a.m. to ensure pick-up. Loose trash will not be picked up, all trash must be bagged. Green Environmental will not pick up trash from 55 gallon barrels. Only standard size trash containers may be used.
- Residents may rent an 80-gallon poly cart at a minimal charge. Contact Moran City Hall at 237-4271 for more information.
- Green Environmental observes the following holidays: New Year's Day, Thanksgiving, and Christmas. If these holidays fall on Tuesday, trash will be picked up on Wednesday.

CITY CODES

- **BURN PERMITS** are required within the City limits, and are issued upon approval by the Moran Fire Department. There is no charge for this permit. Requests to burn may be directed to City Hall at 237-4271.
- **BUILDING PERMITS:** new projects that change the outside perimeter of your existing home/garage/shed/fence, etc., require a building permit. Permits may be applied for at City Hall, with assessed fees of \$1 for \$1,000 with a minimum charge of \$5. Standard reroofing, painting/siding, or replacing **existing** fencing or decks (with no changes to perimeter) do not require a permit. If you have questions or need clarification, please contact City Hall.
- CURFEW RESTRICTIONS: children under the age of 18 cannot wander, lounge, loaf, loiter or play in, about or upon any public street, alley, sidewalk, vacant lot, public place or other place normally accessible to the general public for public use, whether on foot or in a vehicle after the hour of 11:00 PM and until 6:00 AM unless accompanied by parent, legal guardian, or other person exercising legal custody of such child. This restriction shall not apply to children under the age of 18 going by the most direct and accessible route between their homes and authorized places of employment, not to those going by the most direct and accessible route from a place of employment, authorized entertainment, or authorized place of attendance to their residences. The term "authorized" as used in this section shall denote prior authorization by a parent, legal guardian, or other person exercising legal custody.
- LEASH LAW: The Moran Police Department enforces the confinement of all dogs according to Moran City Code, Article 2. Dogs must be vaccinated and tagged yearly by March 31st. See page 6 for more information.
- LITTERING: It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to place, throw, rake, deposit, dump, drop or spill any dirt, filth, excrement, waste material, compost, papers, boxes, ashes, lumber, coal, wood, kindling, grass, weeds, leaves, slops, foreign matter or litter of any kind in or on streets, sidewalks, alleys, parks or

CIVIL DEFENSE WARNINGS

Sirens will sound as follows:

DAILY—sirens sound for ten seconds at noon Mon-Fri

CITY FIRE—sirens sound once for 10 seconds

RURAL FIRE—sirens sound twice for 10 seconds each

TORNADO—sirens will sound for a period of three minutes. The tone will sound over and over again until the threat has passed the City.

Resident will know the threat has passed **once the sirens have <u>stopped sounding</u> for more than one minute**.
