A Note from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

Greetings to all of you and your loved ones. We have begun a gradual reopening for Sunday and weekday Eucharist. While it is still not obligatory to attend Mass on Sunday, I would like to encourage those who are healthy to return to Sunday Mass as circumstances permit. By circumstances I mean the number of attending and your physical or emotional well being.

If fear, vulnerable health, or advanced age play any role in hesitating about Mass attendance, please stay home without feeling guilty about it. Join the Mass online from Saint Olaf at 11:30 AM or the Cathedral or the Pope's Mass.

We ask you to sign up for Masses through our website just to know how many plan to attend and spread the attendance accordingly to 5:30 pm, 9:00 or 11:30 pm. I realize that we all have our favorite time for Masses but let us be flexible at this unusual time if your favorite Mass time is already filled by 40-50 people.

If you signed up and something important came ahead of your intention to attend, please take your name off the list at least the day before.

While in the church we are expected to sit 6 feet apart from those who are not members of the same household.

The reception of Holy Communion on the hand is still the best way to protect others from infection as droplets of saliva are the most common way of infection.

The reception on the hand is a normative way of receiving the Lord in Holy Communion. Let's do it reverently by bowing first and then holding out your hands, one on top of the other, expressing in this gesture our faith and reverence for the Lord.

Please keep 6 feet distance during procession for Communion. The Sign of Peace is being offered without touching but by bowing reverently to those who are around us.

You do not need to wear masks in the church except for the entry or exit when we usually get closer than the 6 feet.

Thank you for your cooperation and willingness to go the extra mile for the sake and well being of us all.

A special "Thank You" to all who contribute to the parish at this difficult time. It helps enormously as we need to pay our bills.

Our Online Giving has been very successful and I would like to encourage you to use it if you are able at this time to support Saint Olaf.

May the Blessings of Almighty, All-Loving God come upon you and your loved ones and remain with you always.

Spiritual Adoption

Month 2-Developing Baby-"I'm dancing!"

Your baby is making progress developing all of her external features and internal organs. Her brain is functioning at 40 days. Her mother can hear her heartbeat now on an ultrasonic stethoscope. Baby-teeth buds are present at 6 1/2 weeks. The central nervous system is functioning and 40 muscle sets begin their first exercises.
