There is controversy on who was actually in charge. In the absence of Williams's younger brothers, Donald and Tormod, the clan acclaimed his cousin Iain a` Chui Bhain chief, and he served as <i>de facto</i> chief until his death, when his son Iain Dubh (who had murdered Donald) took and held Dunvegan by force. On his return, Tormod XII reasserted his right (with extreme prejudice).</p> <p>(See Genealogies)</p> <p>Numbers of chiefs show current thinking.
