Junior Club News

Our Junior program this May 9th at the REACH museum will be to build a rock and mineral display to share at the REACH MUSEUM. We will be using your rocks or minerals to illustrate some common rocks and minerals and provide some information about sedimentary, metamorphic or igneous rocks or mineral to the public.

Juniors you need to select your top 4-5 specimens (rocks or minerals) and Chris will make labels if you provide the appropriate information by May 7th to go in the REACH MUSEUM display. We will build a display with what you bring. While we are setting up the display, we will be sharing what we learned about our specimens and the processes necessary to create them.

Juniors you need to provide the name of the rock or mineral and the descriptor (type of rock or mineral formation using form linked below). For instance, if I wanted to show granite it would be an igneous rock as a descriptor. You would enter granite and igneous together. If you have more than one way it forms, list them, such as a specimen of calcite to show the name would be calcite and I would have the descriptor as sedimentary, igneous or metamorphic.

Bring your rocks or minerals to our May 9th meeting and we will set it up with your display items and learn more about how these form.

Putting Together a Display for the Show

If you're new to the hobby or been at it awhile and have never attempted to put together a display for the annual gem and mineral show it's not all that hard to do. At the April meeting we will provide you with some hints and suggestions to help you organize your materials into a display that you will be proud to have everyone see. And don't worry if you think you don't have enough to fill a display, you can get with someone else and fill it up in no time.

If you are using a Club furnished case all you need are your materials and eye for arranging things into something that is attractive and informative. Where possible you should attempt to label what you are displaying with the name of the material (e.g., jasper, agate, Trilobite, etc.) and the location where the material came from. More tips can be found on the American Federation of Mineralogical Societies (AFMS) website at http://www.amfed.org/rules/rules.htm in the AFMS Uniform Rules. This are the rules used for competitive displaying, but that can be the subject for another discussion some other time.
