EXECUTIVE SESSION

At approximately 7:36 p.m., Mr. Rosenberg moved and Mr. Scott seconded to adopt Resolution #15-47, to enter into an executive session to discuss a contract matter. All in favor, motion carried.

At 8:02 p.m., Mr. Rosenberg moved and Mr. Scott seconded to return to open session. All in favor, motion carried.

Mr. Kiszonak moved and Mr. Scott seconded to schedule a Special Meeting for Thursday, October 29, 2015 at 7:00 p.m. All in favor, motion carried.

CONNECTION FEE SUBCOMMITTEE REPORT

Mr. Piazza, chairperson of the subcommittee, informed the Board that the subcommittee met at 5:30 p.m. and accomplished a lot. They came up with two scenarios, which will be formalized and presented for review and consideration by the entire Board at our next regular meeting.

Mr. Niece asked Mr. Tipton if connection fees are lienable. Mr. Tipton said they are not.

CFO'S REPORT

Mr. Francisco presented the FY2016 Budget as discussed last month with Mr. Olshefski. The budget is approximately \$2.9 million dollars, of which \$2.5 million will be collected from the ratepayers and the remaining \$400,000 from the Rate Stabilization Fund to give the ratepayers a break. The approved budget will be sent to Trenton, and a Public Hearing will be held on December 16, 2015, for adoption at the regular meeting held immediately afterward.

Mr. Piazza moved to adopt Resolution #15-48, for approval of the introduced FY2016 Annual Operating and Capital Budgets, and to certify the FY2016 Annual Budget, including all related schedules, and the FY2016 Capital Budget/Program as presented. Mr. Niece seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Mr. Francisco left the meeting.

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GENERAL COUNSEL'S REPORT

Mr. Tipton will follow up with Tomar on the Municipal Mechanics Lien Claim sent to us by Thomas & Sons Builders.

ENGINEER'S REPORT

Mr. Donati's report was included in the agenda packets.

LaTorre Plaza: Mr. Donati sent a letter to the developer, copied to the County, that all requirements for connecting to the Authority's system have been satisfied, other than payment of our connection fee.

PCFA: Mr. Williams requested copies of the NJPDES permit and DRBC docket for the Oxford plant. PCFA would like to send us more leachate but they are limited by the TDS issue. Mr. Donati provided Mr. Williams with requested documents.

DRBC: The docket renewal application and fee for the Oxford WWTF are due by the end of this month. Signatures and a check for the fee were obtained this evening for submittal to DRBC.

Oxford WWTF ACO: Upon request by CPE, the NJDEP terminated the ACO.

Oxford Upgrade: Payment request #21 has been submitted for \$181,816.88. Mr. Donati presented Change Order #4, which was discussed at last month's meeting. The change order is a combination of six different credits and additions, resulting in an additional combined total of \$8,437.43. Mr. Donati stated that on construction projects, the normal percentage of change orders is 5-10% (in terms of dollars). The Trust automatically allows for 5%. On a treatment plant job, 10% is average, or not unlikely. On this project, the total of all change orders (including #4) is less than ½ of a percent.

Mr. Rosenberg moved and Mr. Kiszonak seconded to adopt Resolution #15-49, authorizing the Chairman to execute change order #4 for Contract #12-01: Oxford WWTF Upgrade. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Warren Haven Pump Stations: We are in the permitting phase, so construction will not begin until next year.

AUTHORITY CONSULTANT

Mr. Wauhop distributed his report prior to the meeting.

Regarding correspondence #1, those items have been resolved.

Belvidere plant: He recapped maintenance items performed during the month. In the vault, between the two FSTs, the 4" PVC decant line was tied into the #2 FST. It will service both

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FSTs. A new 4" PVC line was connected from the scum pit and the sump pit over to that decant line. The weeping holes in the aeration basin were patched and sealed. The hoses and heater were replaced on the Water Street pump station generator set. A bracket was made for the bar grating in the division box.

Mr. Wauhop said the Belvidere plant is now under control versus issues in prior years. There is less sludge hauling.

Oxford plant: Mr. Wauhop recapped maintenance items performed during the month. The new clarifiers were painted. All three pump stations were serviced in preparation for winter weather. Pipes were installed in the aeration basin with Tom Bartha Excavating. New shut off valves were installed at the head of the sewer treatment plant with Tom Bartha. A return line was relocated to the head of the plant.

Under general business, work continues on sludge thickening at the Belvidere plant. The plant will run a lot better this winter.

The outdoor light poles from the Oxford facility will be auctioned off on-line on October 26.

Final flow numbers are almost complete. Yesterday, Mr. Wauhop met with Mr. Olshefski and Mr. Francisco to review the numbers with the new I&I factor under consideration. Bills to the users should be lower, since the Authority is utilizing funds from the Rate Stabilization Fund to offset part of the FY2016 Budget.

Mr. Wauhop is still checking on another price for rekeying the buildings' locks. He may just cut back on the number of keys that are changed. This is not something that has to be done right away.

He will present a cell phone policy to the Board at the November regular meeting. Chairman Chamberlain offered to give Mr. Wauhop a cell phone policy he developed for his workplace.

Mr. Wauhop obtained a quote to work on the UVs at the Belvidere plant. The current panels are obsolete and one does not work. The proposal is for \$3,000 per bank, so for three banks the cost would be \$9,000. There is money in the maintenance budget for this, so, he asked the Board for its approval to spend up to \$10,000 to revamp that UV section.

Mr. Scott moved and Mr. Piazza seconded to authorize up to \$10,000 be spent to upgrade the UVs. All in favor, motion carried.

FINANCE (TREASURER)

Mr. Piazza reviewed the monthly financial report. The Authority is in excellent shape financially.

Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #15-50 (Certificate No. 351: \$81,754.58) be approved to pay

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all bills from the Operating Fund as presented. Mr. Scott seconded. The motion passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

Regarding the capital bills, Mr. Piazza recommended reducing the amount paid to Tomar by \$45,000 in liquidated damages (30 days x \$1,500 a day). Therefore, in lieu of their requested amount of \$181,816.88, the payment to Tomar should be \$136,816.88. Mr. Piazza moved that Resolution #15-51 (Certificate No. 359: \$188,324.61) be approved to pay all bills from the Capital Improvements Fund as presented, with the caveat that the Tomar bill will be paid as stated above. Mr. Rosenberg seconded. The motion passed unanimously on roll call vote.

<u>UNFINISHED BUSINESS</u>

Mr. Piazza moved that a letter be sent to the owner of the LaTorre Plaza, informing him that based on legal advice we cannot institute payment plans for connection fees. Mr. Niece seconded. Mr. Donati will draft the letter and have Mr. Tipton review it. All in favor, motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

There was no new business.

PUBLIC COMMENT

There was no public present.

As there was no more business to come before the Authority, Mr. Rosenberg moved and Mr. Piazza seconded that the meeting be adjourned. All in favor, motion carried. The meeting was adjourned at 8:35 p.m.

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget and Capital Budget for the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority for the fiscal year beginning, January 1, 2016 and ending, December 31, 2016 has been presented before the governing body of the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority at its open public meeting of October 21, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Annual Budget as introduced reflects Total Revenues of \$2,539,599, Total Appropriations, including any Accumulated Deficit if any, of \$2,939,599 and Total Unrestricted Net Position utilized of \$400,000; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget as introduced reflects Total Capital Appropriations of \$685,000 and Total Unrestricted Net Position planned to be utilized as funding thereof, of \$600,000; and

WHEREAS, the schedule of rates, fees and other charges in effect will produce sufficient revenues, together with all other anticipated revenues to satisfy all obligations to the holders of bonds of the Authority, to meet operating expenses, capital outlays, debt service requirements, and to provide for such reserves, all as may be required by law, regulation or terms of contracts and agreements; and

WHEREAS, the Capital Budget/Program, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 5:31-2, does not confer any authorization to raise or expend funds; rather it is a document to be used as part of the said Authority's planning and management objectives. Specific authorization to expend funds for the purposes described in this section of the budget, must be granted elsewhere; by bond resolution, by a project financing agreement, by resolution appropriating funds from the Renewal and Replacement Reserve or other means provided by law.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the governing body of the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority, at an open public meeting held on October 21, 2015 that the Annual Budget, including all related schedules, and the Capital Budget/Program of the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority for the fiscal year beginning, January 1, 2016 and ending, December 31, 2016 is hereby approved; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the anticipated revenues as reflected in the Annual Budget are of sufficient amount to meet all proposed expenditures/expenses and all covenants, terms and provisions as stipulated in the said Authority's outstanding debt obligations, capital lease arrangements, service contracts, and other pledged agreements; and

BE-IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the governing body of the Warren County (PR) Municipal Utilities Authority will consider the Annual Budget and Capital Budget/Program for adoption on December 16, 2015.
