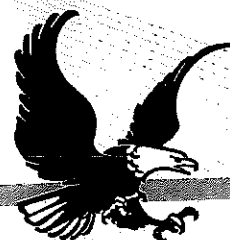
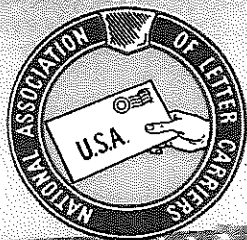

Recently we have had some issues with the Network and Phone connectivity at the Hall. That will be corrected this week with the installation new lines running throughout the hall. The board had discussed the issues in early February. So that we can all understand the issues we must first look at how far we have come at this hall.

First of all, there are better Branch Historians than I am, as I joined as a Letter Carrier in 1988. This is what I know. Branch 1477's First Hall was in the 33701 Zip Code off of 4th Street So. in St. Petersburg. The building was completed by the Letter Carriers at the time.

As time passed the NALC began to encourage the mergers of branches that were not large or experienced enough to provide consistent representation to NALC Members. As a result,

Branch 1477 expanded to represent 10 cities along the West Coast of Florida. We then relocated to a location 12850 66th Street No, Largo Florida. This was a larger facility that too had a portion of the work completed by the members. It also came with a mortgage that for many years special Dues Assessments were discussed and voted down. When we first came to this hall we brought the phones from the 66th Street Location and just plugged them in.

NEXT BRANCH MEETING AT THE HALL AND VIA ZOOM: THURSDAY, MARCH 12, 2026

Racetrack Corporation proposed to pay off the mortgage and relocate the branch to a building of our suiting, pay for renovations and pay off the cost of the new location leaving the Branch mortgage free.

We relocated to the Park Boulevard location in 2006, in the building formerly Hale Realtor. The building had been a Call Center at some point in time, and the Hall still includes miles of phone lines tucked in the ceiling and into a cabinet that is obsolete as we now run off of Cat 5 cables.

When we first came to this hall we brought the phones from the 66th Street Location and just plugged them in. Over the years we have added Cable Lines for Internet and a Voice Over Internet Protocol phone system.¹

With all the patchwork being completed on the phone system and Internet over the past years, Treasurer Chuck Cacichio discovered duplicate modems and routers that we were being charged for. Chuck arranged for a Technology Company to come in and fix the system and rewiring the network. Which will begin this week.

In the midst of all this disruption, we made efforts to communicate through the Stewards the issues with phones and computer network. Of course, as is usually the case a conspiracy theory was set into place on a text thread which was unfounded but as usual some members and individuals always take what they read on social media, and text messages as fact. I learned a long time ago to:

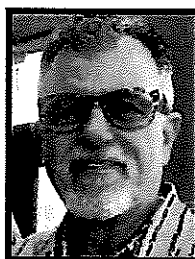

Eligibility

All employees who have a single or combined service-connected disability rating of 30 percent or more are eligible for Wounded Warriors Leave.

Employees with Pending Disability Determinations

Otherwise, eligible employees with pending disability determinations who at any time during any Leave Year receive a 30 percent or more disability rating, will be eligible for leave retroactively to the first day of that current Leave Year. Any leave without pay (LWOP) or leave used while the determination is pending will be reimbursed and replaced with Wounded Warriors Leave, as appropriate, up to the maximum number of hours allowed.

Meeting called to order at 7:00 p.m. by President Joe Henschen

President Henschen then wanted to change the order of business. However, Chris Hubble objected to changing the order. He agreed to allow after the Reading of Official Correspondence.

Reading of Official Correspondence:

Read the Formal Appeal of President Henschen of the Election Committees Decision to have a rerun election.

FORMAL APPEAL OF THE DECISION OF THE ELECTION COMMITTEE RELATING TO THE ELECTION OF THE BRANCH 1477 PRESIDENT.

Submitted Under Article 21.2 Appeals of NALC Regulations Governing Branch Election Procedures.

January 9, 2026

Branch 1477 Executive Board.

The Branch received a Formal Appeal regarding the Election of NALC Branch 1477 President on December 15, 2025. The Appeal was dated December 12, 2025

The Election Committee was convened on December 19, 2025. I, President Elect Henschen made 1 request. Make your decision with the knowledge that I will be on annual leave from December 23 to December 29, 2025, and explained that the decision was required within Thirty (30) Days and asked if the annual leave dates were considered, so any appeal right time limits could be honored. The decision, however, was made to issue the decision and delay notifying me of the written decision apparently with the intent to deny me any

appeal rights as outlined in the NALC Regulations Governing Branch Election Procedures.

Upon my return I monitored the incoming mail for the official decision to protect those time limits. I was not told that the decision of the committee had arrived and date stamped received on December 26, 2025, until the executive board meeting on January 6, 2026. When Financial/Recording Secretary Ken Grasso read the decision at that meeting. I maintain the time limits for appeal of this matter began on January 6, 2026.

The Basis of the Appeal

Specification 1: was listed as an alleged violation of Article 9.1 requiring that the Branch all candidates equally: any and all/ privileges extended to one candidate by the branch must be extended to all candidates. This specification also references the Office of Labor-Management Standards.

The Branch By-Laws include in part:

Article 4 Elections
Section 1.

A. Election of officers and delegates shall be held by Mail Balloting in accordance with the NALC Constitution and NALC Regulations governing Branch Elections Procedures.

The preamble of the NALC Regulations Governing Branch Elections Procedures states in part: The rules and regulations contained in this booklet were promulgated by the NALC Executive Council pursuant to its constitutional authority. Article 8 Section 5.c of the NALC Constitution provides: The National Constitution Provides "The National Executive Council is hereby empowered to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations for the conduct of all elections in the Branches" It is my contention that any references in the original appeal to the Office of Labor-Management Standards would have been considered when the NALC Executive Council established these rules in November of 1981, and adopted them again in March of 2008, and March of 2011. The NALC has full authority over the governance of Branch Elections. The Complainant

relies on rules outside the NALC's established rules and regulations.

Article 9.1 NALC Regulations governing Branch Elections Procedures states: The Branch must treat all candidates equally: any and all privileges extended to one candidate by the branch must be extended to all candidates.

Comments: An example of equal treatment: if a branch permits one candidate to copy membership list all other candidates must be allowed to copy it.

It has been a long-standing practice of the Branch that a fully prepared mailing done off the clock and off the premises may be presented for labeling by the Branch Clerical Secretary. I was never given a copy of the mailing list. As in past elections I presented a prepared mailing for labeling, completed at my home and presented. This is evidenced by a picture of the mailing preparation illustrating location of the work completed.

Article 9.2 States in relevant part: A Branch must honor **all reasonable requests** to distribute campaign literature at a candidates expense.

As mentioned, this practice has been consistently used in Branch 1477 as recently as 2012. Words have meaning in this context.

Words have meanings **No requests were made to for assistance with a mailing**

Specification 2: charges a violation of **Article 9.7** Branch officers and candidates may not use branch funds, employees, office space, telephones, facilities, equipment or materials to campaign, alleging that I, O.D. and Theresa have gained access to use branch computers as well as the printer and materials.

I did not use any Branch Funds to complete this mailing. I attached an invoice and receipt for:

USPS Postage \$780.00

Staples \$450.86 for the printing/folding of O.D. Elliot's endorsement letter.

Ray Anthony Printer Inc. \$230.05 for Letters/folded and Envelopes

Proof of payment to Branch 1477, \$19.54 for labels, label printing and glue sticks.

No branch funds, or equipment was used that was that was not reimbursed that would not have been offered to any other candidate if requested.

The author of the Committee's report addressed issues the Candidates appeal when addressing an alleged violation of Article 12.7 of the NALC Regulations Governing Branch Election Procedures and the surrendering of the Branch Post Office Box Keys. The Chairman questioned the security of the ballots and apparently feels it necessary to accuse me of possibly committing a felony by tampering with the mail.

The P.O. Box in question is a moderate size box. Everyone on the board is familiar with the box section in the Post Office. Clerks box mail from the back and normally the boxes are not receiving a large amount of mail. The Branch PO Box is used one time a year for elections of Officers and Delegates (if needed) anyone with access to the Pinellas Park Workroom floor can have access to the box mail that is tubbed due to the volume, Anyone with access, it could be a Candidate hanging a Flyer or any other Officer or member of the Branch accessing the Pinellas Park Post Office. At the time the request was made, I admit I was unaware that there could be a nexus drawn between securing ballots collected from the PO Box and securing mail in a location when the count was not completed. (as stated in Article 12.7)
The keys remained in the Branch Safe.

As mentioned, the steps to campaign would have been equally afforded any candidate making a request as they have been for many years. To include prior elections.

Decision of the Branch's Executive Board regarding President Henschen's Formal Appeal of the Election Committees Decision to have a rerun election.

Attention: President Joe Henschen

Subject: Notice of Formal Appeal Concerning the Election Committee's Decision for Re-Run Election for Office of President of Branch 1477 for the term 2026-2028

Dear Mr. Henschen,

On January 15, 2026, a meeting of the Board was called upon the request of five (5) of its members provided for in Branch 1477 Bylaws, Article 10, Section 7.D. to discuss a Formal Appeal of the Decision of the Election Committee by Candidate Joe Henschen relating to the election of the Branch 1477 Office of President. All members were notified via text of the time and date of meeting. Eight (8) members attended in person, two (2) attended the meeting via Webex, for a total of ten (10) members present. One (1) member left before the end of the meeting.

In Candidate Joe Henschen's appeal, he stated that during the Election Committee's meeting to evaluate a Formal Appeal that had been made about the conduct of the election, he asked the Committee to hold off sending their decision until after he returned from scheduled Annual Leave after December 29, 2025. The Election Committee had no requirement to honor the request as his 5 days allowed for a response would not start until he had received the appeal decision. It appears the reason he did not get to hear about the appeal is that immediately after his Annual Leave ended, he was out on Sick Leave until the day of January 5, 2026, and therefore was not at work to see the Appeal Decision. There was no intent to deprive him of his appeal rights.

In Candidate Joe Henschen's Specification 1 he only referenced a portion of the Preamble from the NALC's Regulations. The last sentence of the paragraph he mentioned goes on to say: "The most recent changes consist of minor clarifications and updated references to applicable law and

Department of Labor regulations". He contends that the Complainant (Candidate Hubble) relied on rules outside the NALC's established rules and regulations, but as mentioned above, the NALC referenced the Department of Labor as applicable law that needs to be followed. Therefore, it does not appear that Candidate Hubble relied on rules outside the NALC's established regulations as Joe Henschen contended.

Article 9.1 NALC Regulations governing Branch Elections Procedures states: The Branch must treat all candidates equally: any and all privileges extended to one candidate by the branch must be extended to all candidates.

Comments: An example of equal treatment: if a branch permits one candidate to copy membership list, all other candidates must be allowed to copy it.

Article 9.1 also includes the paragraph below, but was not referred to by Candidate Henschen:

There are no exceptions to the requirement of equal treatment. The Department of Labor scrutinizes this aspect of elections very closely and will set aside elections based upon even minor violations.

Candidate Henschen stated that it has been a long-standing practice of the Branch that a fully prepared mailing done off the clock and off the premises may be presented for labeling by the Branch Clerical Secretary. I was never given a copy of the mailing list. As in past elections I presented a prepared mailing for labeling, completed at my home and presented. This is evidenced by a picture of the mailing preparation illustrating location of work completed.

According to Branch 1477 Bylaws, Article 4, Section 1.A.

A. Election of officers and delegates shall be held by Mail Balloting in accordance with the NALC Constitution and NALC Regulations Governing Branch Elections Procedures. The Election Date (by which all ballots must be received) will be the Regular Branch Meeting date in December.

Nominations of officers and delegates will be held at the November meeting of the Branch. (**Adopted 12/4/2015**)

Nowhere in the Branch's Bylaws is the term long-standing practice ever mentioned. Branch 1477 Bylaws are the method from which the Branch operates. In the NALC's Regulations Governing Branch Election Procedures, 1.1, it is stated:

The Executive Council may exempt branches from any of these regulations to the extent permitted by law. However, branches must request an exemption at least 90 days before the scheduled date of the election.

Branches may also adopt additional rules in their own by-laws provided the rules are not inconsistent with federal law, the NALC Constitution and these regulations.

So, the use of long-standing practice could have been established in our Bylaws, but it was not. To allow that now, it would be against the NALC's Regulations Governing Branch Election Procedures.

Candidate Henschen stated he was never given a copy of the mailing list, but when instructing Branch Clerical Secretary to print him labels, they were in fact the by-product of the list.

In this instance, Candidate Henschen assumed the position of being "**The Branch**". He gave himself permission to obtain labels printed from the Branch's mailing list, but in that capacity failed to extend that same permission to Candidate Hubble.

Article 9.2 states in relevant part: A Branch must honor all reasonable requests to distribute campaign literature at a candidate's expense.

Additionally, **9.2** further provides: In order to avoid complaints of unequal treatment, branches should advise all candidates in advance of the conditions under which it will distribute literature and should promptly advise all candidates of any changes in those conditions.

Candidate Henschen contends this practice has

been consistently used in Branch 1477 as recently as 2012. Words have meaning in this context.

The board was unable to find that this practice has been consistently followed as recently as 2012. There was no Election of Officers in 2012, so we couldn't verify how this would have happened and under what circumstances. No one present on the Executive Board was aware of this practice.

Words do have meanings. **No requests were made for assistance with a mailing. No requests were made by either candidate to "the Branch."**

Specification 2: 9.7 states:

Branch officers and candidates may not use branch funds, employees, office space, telephones, facilities, equipment or materials to campaign.

Candidate Henschen stated he did not use any Branch Funds to complete this mailing. While that statement may be true, included in his appeal his invoice clearly states he used 52 pages of labels printing. He used an Employee, (Branch Clerical Secretary) to print labels that she did via Branch computer while on the clock and being paid, and the use of the Branch's printer which clearly would be considered equipment.

As former and current Letter Carriers, we are familiar with the P.O. Box section in the Post Office. It is common practice to tub P.O. Box only after large amounts of mail come in for a box. In the interim, the letters are placed in the box which would be accessible by use of the key.

For an Election to be transparent and appear above board, perhaps the Chairman of the Election Committee thought it was inappropriate for a candidate to have possession of the P.O. Box key.

The NALC Regulations Governing Branch Election Procedures was Approved by the Executive Council as of **March 2011**. All Elections must be held in accordance with these regulations.

The Executive Board Members present contend that the failure of equal treatment being extended to

Candidate Hubble regarding the copying of the Branch's mailing list/via labels printed, that resulted in Campaign mailings to 1,000 members (as specified in included invoices for their printing), provided a definite advantage to Candidate Henschen over Candidate Hubble in the outcome of the election.

After careful review and consideration of the contents of Candidate Joe Henschen's Formal Appeal, the Executive Board Members present voted unanimously to deny his appeal to overturn the Election Committee's Decision to have a rerun of the election for Office of NALC Branch 1477 President, from the point of nomination.

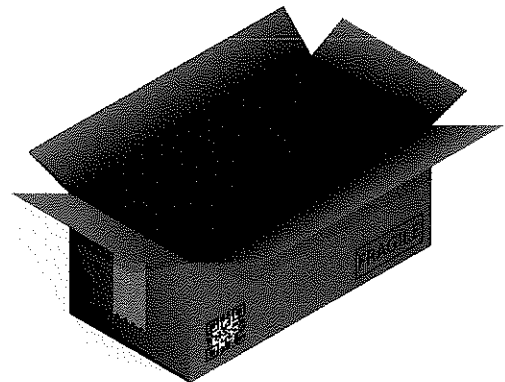
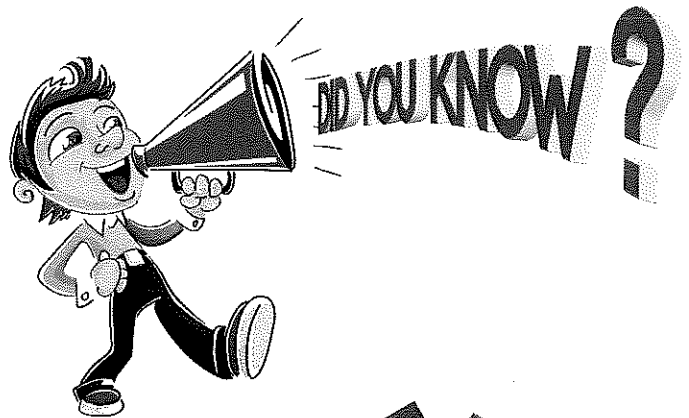
Let Me Tell Ya A Question!!

Did you know, before 1913 it was perfectly legal to mail your children through the U.S. Postal Service?

Parents would sometimes attach postage directly to a child's clothing and send them to relatives, relying on mail carriers to transport them, often via train. While this seems wild today, it was a documented practice in the early days of Parcel Post, usually covering short distances. Although one child was sent over 700 miles.

So, the next time you complain about a signature package, just be glad it's not someone's kid you have to deliver.

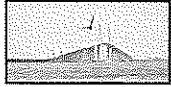
