What's Happening

This bulletin contains everything you need to participate in the service. All are welcome to join in this celebration of praise and Holy Eucharist.

Parking Lot Church!

- Remember, we are safer at home and online worship will be streaming. If you are not feeling well, have been exposed to COVID-19, or are being treated for COVID-19, you need to stay home.
- The service will be broadcast over the outdoor speakers and streamed to Zoom and Facebook Live.
- Make sure you bring your face mask and wear it if you are in a vulnerable population.
- Bring a water bottle and umbrella with you as it may get hot by the end of the service.
- All greetings, the Peace, and conversations must be physically distanced.
- We will not have paper bulletins.
 You will need a mobile device or print at home.
- There will be a collection basket if you would like to bring your offering.

Entrance:

- As you enter the parking lot, please follow directions to your parking space.
- You are welcome to put chairs by your car, put up a small pop-up tent, or remain in your car.
- We require you to maintain good physical distancing, at least 1

- parking space or 6-feet distance from others.
- We will be making note of who is present in the parking lot in case we need to do contact tracing.
- Bring a device with you to stream the service or download the bulletin.

Bathroom:

- Emergency bathrooms are available in the Education wing. Follow the signs. The bathrooms are for one-at-a time use, please wait for the previous person to exit.
- A mask or face covering is required to enter the building. Masks will be provided at the door, if you don't have one.
- Please only touch the surfaces that are necessary and wipe them with a disinfecting wipe afterward.

Readers for the service:

 From home, read as usual. If you are in the parking lot, come to the microphone and after the reading, please wipe the mic with a disinfecting wipe.

Holy Eucharist:

 This morning we will be celebrating Holy Eucharist. Communion will only be by wafer. At the time of the invitation to Communion, please stay at your car, Pastor Jenni will bring the sacrament to you.



Song of Praise

Blessed by the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, by divine mercy we have a new birth into a living hope; Through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, we have an inheritance that is imperishable in heaven. The First Lesson

Reader: A reading from the book of Isaiah (55:1-5)

Thus says the Lord:

"Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters;

and you that have no money, come, buy and eat!

Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price.

Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labor for that which does not satisfy?

Listen carefully to me, and eat what is good, and delight yourselves in rich food.

Incline your ear, and come to me; listen, so that you may live.

I will make with you an everlasting covenant, my steadfast, sure love for David.

See, I made him a witness to the peoples, a leader and commander for the peoples.

See, you shall call nations that you do not know, and nations that do not know you shall run to you,

because of the LORD your God, the Holy One of Israel, for he has glorified you."

Reader: The Word of the Lord.
People: Thanks be to God.

The Psalm (145:8-9, 15-22)

Reader: Let us say the psalm responsively by half-verse.

The Lord is gracious and full of compassion, * slow to anger and of great kindness.

The Lord is loving to everyone * and his compassion is over all his works.

The Lord upholds all those who fall; * he lifts up those who are bowed down.

The eyes of all wait upon you, O Lord, * and you give them their food in due season.

You open wide your hand * and satisfy the needs of every living creature.

The Lord is righteous in all his ways * and loving in all his works.

The Lord is near to those who call upon him, *

to all who call upon him faithfully.

He fulfills the desire of those who fear him; * he hears their cry and helps them.

The Lord preserves all those who love him, * but he destroys all the wicked.

My mouth shall speak the praise of the Lord; * let all flesh bless his holy Name for ever and ever.

The Second Lesson

Reader: A reading from Paul's letter to the Romans. (9:1-5)

I am speaking the truth in Christ—I am not lying; my conscience confirms it by the Holy Spirit—I have great sorrow and unceasing anguish in my heart. For I could wish that I myself were accursed and cut off from Christ for the sake of my own people, my kindred according to the flesh. They are Israelites, and to them belong the adoption, the glory, the covenants, the giving of the law, the worship, and the promises; to them belong the patriarchs, and from them, according to the flesh, comes the Messiah, who is

over all, God blessed forever. Amen.

Reader: The Word of the Lord.
People: Thanks be to God.

The Gospel

Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Matthew. (14:13-21)

People: Glory to you, Lord Christ.

Celebrant: Jesus withdrew in a boat to a deserted place by himself. But when the crowds

heard it, they followed him on foot from the towns. When he went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them and cured their sick. When it was evening, the disciples came to him and said, "This is a deserted place, and the hour is now late; send the crowds away so that they may go into the villages and buy food for themselves." Jesus said to them, "They need not go away; you give them something to eat." They replied, "We have nothing here but five loaves and two fish." And he said, "Bring them here to me." Then he ordered the crowds to sit down on the grass. Taking the five loaves and the two fish, he

looked up to heaven, and blessed and broke the loaves, and gave them to the disciples, and the disciples gave them to the crowds. And all ate and were filled; and they took up what was left over of the broken pieces, twelve baskets full. And

those who ate were about five thousand men, besides women and children.

The Sermon The Rev. Jenni Liem

The Nicene Creed

Celebrant and People, say together
We believe in one God,
the Father, the Almighty,
maker of heaven and earth,
of all that is, seen and unseen.

We believe in one Lord, Jesus Christ, the only Son of God, eternally begotten of the Father, God from God, Light from Light, true God from true God, begotten, not made, of one Being with the Father. Through him all things were made. For us and for our salvation he came down from heaven: by the power of the Holy Spirit he became incarnate from the Virgin Mary, and was made man. For our sake he was crucified under Pontius Pilate; he suffered death and was buried. On the third day he rose again in accordance with the Scriptures; he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. People: Amen.





The Great Thanksgiving

Enriching Our Worship 1, Prayer 1

Presider: The Lord be with you.

People: And also with you.

Presider: Lift up your hearts.
People: We lift them to the Lord.

Presider: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God. People: It is right to give God thanks and praise.

It is truly right, and good and joyful, to give you thanks, all-holy God, source of life and fountain of mercy. For you are the source of light and life, you made us in your image, and called us to new life in Jesus Christ our Lord. Therefore, joining with Angels and Archangels and with the faithful of every generation, we lift our voices with all creation as we say/sing:

Holy, holy, holy Lord.
God of power and might.
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosannah in the highest!
Blessed is the one who comes
in the Name of the Lord
Hosannah in the highest!

Blessed are you, gracious God, creator of the universe and giver of life. You formed us in your own image and called us to dwell in your infinite love. You gave the world into our care that we might be your faithful stewards and show forth your bountiful grace. But we failed

to honor your image in one another and in ourselves; we would not see your goodness in the world around us; and so we violated your creation, abused one another, and rejected your love.

Yet you never ceased to care for us, and prepared the way of salvation for all people. Through Abraham and Sarah you called us into covenant with you. You delivered us from slavery, sustained us in the wilderness, and raised up prophets to renew your promise of salvation.

Then, in the fullness of time, you sent your eternal Word, made mortal flesh in Jesus. Born into the human family, and dwelling among us, he revealed your glory. Giving himself freely to death on the cross, he triumphed over evil, opening the way of freedom and life. On the night before he died for us, our Savior Jesus Christ took bread, and when he had given thanks to you, he broke it, and gave it to his friends, and said: "Take, eat: This is my Body which is given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me."

As supper was ending, Jesus took the cup of wine, and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, and said: "Drink this, all of you: This is my Blood of the new Covenant, which is poured out for you and for all for the forgiveness of sins. Whenever you drink it, do this for the remembrance of me."

Therefore we proclaim the mystery of faith:

People:

Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again.

Remembering his death and resurrection, we now present to you from your creation this bread and this wine. By your Holy Spirit may they be for us the Body and Blood of our Savior Jesus Christ. Grant that we who share these gifts may be filled with the Holy Spirit and live as Christ's Body in the world.

Bring us into the everlasting heritage of your daughters and sons, that with the everblessed Virgin Mary and all your saints, past, present, and yet to come, we may praise your Name for ever.

Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, to you be honor, glory, and praise, for ever and ever.

People: Amen!

The Lord's Prayer

Celebrant: And now as our savior Christ has taught us, we are bold to say:

People: Our Father, who art in heaven,

hallowed be thy Name,

thy kingdom come, thy will be done,

on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation,
but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the kingdom,
and the power, and the glory,

Spiritual Communion

On this Sunday morning, we offer this service of Spiritual Communion. The Book of Common Prayer reminds us that if one is unable to actually consume the consecrated bread and wine due to extreme sickness or disability, the desire is enough for God to grant all the benefits of communion (p. 457). When being present at a celebration of the Eucharist is absolutely impossible, this act of prayer and meditation can provide the means by which you can associate yourself with the Eucharistic Action and open yourself to God's grace and blessing. Collect

Celebrant: Let the power of the Holy Spirit come upon me, O Lord, I ask you: that my heart

may be cleansed and defend me from all adversities. Through Christ our Lord.

People: Amen.

Celebrant and People: Father, I desire to offer you praise and thanksgiving. I believe that you are

present in the Bread and Wine of the Holy Sacrament. And since I cannot now receive you in the Sacrament, I ask you to come into my heart. I unite myself with you and embrace you with all the affections of my soul. Let me never be separated

from you. Let me live and die in your love. Amen.

Celebrant: Come Lord Jesus, dwell in you servants in the fullness of your strength, in the

perfection of all you ways, and in the holiness of your spirit, and rule over every hostile power in the might of your Spirit, and to the glory of our Father.

People: Amen.

Postcommunion Prayer

Celebrant: Let us pray.

People: God of abundance,

you have fed us with the bread of life

and the cup of salvation;

you have united us with Christ and one another;

and you have made us one

with all your people in heaven and on earth. Now send us forth in the power of your Spirit,

that we may proclaim your redeeming love to the world

and continue for ever in the risen life

of Christ our Savior. Amen.


Welcome & Announcements The Blessing
