


Show Us Your Spirit!

Recently Summerset's Public Works Department has been working on numbering all of the City light poles with numerical stickers. This will help us all more easily identify which street light needs replaced. Below are just a couple examples of some number light poles.





Public Works

As we move closer and closer to the winter months we also get closer and closer to snowy cold days. We would like to remind residents about our snow removal ordinance.

18.01.02 SNOW REMOVAL DECLARATION.

Such time the Director of Public Works or his or her designee determines that snow removal from the public streets will commence and declares a Snow Removal Alert.

18.01.03 SNOW ROUTE RESTRICTIONS-DESIGNATED.

By resolution of the City Commission, the City may designate certain City streets as Emergency and Secondary Snow Routes to ensure said streets can be cleared of snow for the safe and orderly flow of traffic and for the health, safety and welfare of the general public.

18.01.04 NO PARKING ON SNOW ROUTES.

No person may park or allow to remain parked any vehicle or trailer on any street designated as Emergency Snow Route or Secondary Snow Route during snowfall or prior to the time said street is cleared of snow by the City.

Vehicles or trailers parked on snow routes in violation of this section may be ticketed and/or towed at the owner's expense. Violations of this chapter shall be subject to the fine established by City Resolution.



Happy Holidays from the Summerset Police Department. We wanted to take the time to remind everyone to have a safe Holiday season. With Holiday gatherings, comes Holiday parties. If you chose to drink, please have a designated driver.

According to the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) 37,133 people were killed in motor vehicle crashes in 2017. 10,874 of those fatalities occurred in crashes involving a drunk driver. In December of last year, 885 people were killed in crashes involving a drunk driver.
