Our partner Niños y Niñas celebrates the 25th anniversary of its creation this year. It all began on a street corner in downtown Querétaro when its founder Susana Vargas (shown in the center of the photo accompanied by Byron, Charles, Juliet and Margarita) provided instruction to migrant children under a large umbrella to block the sun.



The group now has a welcoming facility in town where it offers a preschool program, assistance with homework and a nutritious meal to 76 children and adolescents who come from indigenous families that have moved to Querétaro from their home communities throughout Mexico.

We are proud to announce that we have begun a partnership with La Cima (Spanish for "the summit"), a nonprofit organization in Querétaro that provides scholarships, a safe home, and personal development programs for young women attending universities in the city.



These young women are dedicated and serious students. Last year, they participated in more than 1,500 hours of human development workshops, received more than 2,300 hours of individual academic advice, and attended more than 20,000 hours of university classes and 1,000 hours of English instruction.

Two recent examples of success are Mayra and Lupita. Mayra graduated from a local technical school with a specialization in environmental engineering and now has found an excellent job in that field. Lupita completed with honors a Bachelor of Music degree with a specialty in piano, won a Young Piano Virtuoso competition, and now shares her skills and passion as a piano teacher.
