

### Day Meeting

The Day meeting for **March 18** will be a plant swap and potluck picnic at Smither Park (2441 Munger, Houston, TX 77023), a beautiful unique park affiliated with, and adjacent to the Houston Orange Show. Note that the meeting is one week later than usual to avoid Spring Break.

We will meet at 10:00 am under the pavilion. There is plenty of on street parking, and you should be able to easily drop off items before parking.


- (1) There are no restrooms at the park, but there are three convenience store/gas stations on the south side of Hwy 45 at Wayside, a 3 minute drive away.
- (2) We will have handwashing stations at the pavilion.
- (3) There are no tables and chairs under the pavilion, so we need to bring these. I have a table and 8 chairs. Cynthia C. has 2 tables. Joan J. has a card table and 3 chairs. **Let me know if you have a table or chairs** you can bring. Everyone should plan on bringing a folding chair, and these extras will be just in case any of us don't have a folding chair.
- (4) I have a few plastic table cloths, and will bring several other fabric cloths. Let me know if you have a table cloth you can bring.
- (5) We need a volunteer for bringing a beverage to share. I will bring our reusable cups and a cooler of ice. **Let me know if you can bring a herbie beverage** this will be your potluck contribution.
- (6) Bring a picnic dish (serves 8) to share.
- (7) Bring a plate and your utensils. I'll have some extras or disposable ones in case you forget.

We will have our herb plant swap first.

- (1) Each member that brings a plant to swap (up to 4) gets a number for each plant. i.e. If you bring 3, you get 3 random numbers. Bring 1, get 1.
- (2) We will call out numbers and you pick a plant when your number is called.
- (3) You can bring more than 4 plants. Any plants left after all members have chosen will be up for grabs.
- (4) You can bring cuttings, but the plants for the swap should be potted and rooted.
- (5) You can bring non-herb plants, but we'll preferentially swap herbs first.
- (6) Any leftover or extra plants we can sell at the Herbal Marketplace at Herb Day.

# HerbTV from American Botanical Council Officially Launches on YouTube

With nearly 1.4 million views already recorded, HerbTV is positioned to become the leading international online portal for videos on botanicals and herbal medicine

AUSTIN, Texas (February 24, 2025) – As part of its ongoing educational mission for consumers, academia, industry, media and government, the nonprofit American Botanical Council (ABC) is pleased to announce the official launch of ABC's YouTube channel, HerbTV.

HerbTV from the American Botanical Council on YouTube.com is the home of more than 180 educational videos on medicinal herbs and related health and wellbeing content and includes interviews and in-field tours with renowned herbalists, botanists, and ethnobotanists. The channel already has more than 21,000 subscribers and nearly 1.4 million views.

To provide easy access to the educational content on the channel, HerbTV features playlists organized by category and health conditions, as well as ABC's new Adopt-an-Herb videos, videos and webinars on herbal sustainability, and sources outside of ABC, including the public television series *Healing Quest*, "The Medicine Hunter", and others. New content is being added weekly.

"The American Botanical Council has been working to expand its educational mission through videos for a number of years," said ABC Founder and Executive Director Mark Blumenthal. "We're highly pleased to finally release HerbTV as an international online portal that we anticipate will greatly expand the interest in and understanding about numerous herbs and botanical medicine for anyone seeking accurate, and entertaining video content."

According to the Council for Responsible Nutrition's 2024 Consumer Survey, three-quarters of Americans use dietary supplements, many of them being herbal. The World Health Organization estimates that around 4 billion people, or 80 percent of the people in developing countries, use herbal medicine.



She teaches, lectures, and writes about gardening and cooking, and is a food writer, editor and photographer who has authored and edited over 25 books and hundreds of articles. She is also an HSA member of the Potomac Unit and a recipient of the HSA's prestigious Joanna McQuail Reed Award for the Artistic Use of Herbs. Growing vegetables, herbs, and flowers organically, harvesting them at their peak, and bringing them into the kitchen to create healthy recipes is a way of life for Susan. She is passionate about herbs & her work - sharing the joy of gardening & cooking through teaching & writing - & inspiring others to get in touch with their senses of smell & taste. Susan's new book The Perfect Bite will be available for purchase and book signing.

**Tina Marie Wilcox** has been the head gardener and herbalist at the Ozark Folk Center's Heritage Herb Garden in Mountain View, Arkansas since 1984. She tends the extensive gardens, plans and coordinates annual herbal events and workshops, and facilitates the production and sale of plants, seeds, and herbal products for the park. She also gives lectures and workshops throughout the United States in herb growing, living history, and herb use.
