

This is a small charity that provides intensive and practical support to a socially isolated group of women involved in street prostitution. Our members provided items which would support the outreach work, such as sanitary wear, chocolates, socks, hats and hygiene items. At Christmas we made gift bags for the charity to distribute. Many of our fundraising events have gone to supporting this cause, such as the cake stall at the Nether Edge festival, swishing events and a fashion show. We raised over £800 for S.W.W.O.P.





<u>Email Fraud – Warning from a recent experience at Crosspool WI</u>

Recently, Crosspool WI received an email apparently from a well-known company, headed with the company logo, advising us of an invoice to be paid to them at our earliest opportunity.

We had held our monthly committee meeting earlier that week, and this payment had not appeared in the Treasurer's report nor was it discussed during our meeting. Our suspicions raised, we contacted Action Fraud for advice.

Action Fraud quickly identified the email as an example of **Mandate Fraud**. This typically occurs when a fraudster emails a very large number of organisations seeking responses. Simply phoning the fraudster, or clicking on an attachment in the email, to check whether the demand is legitimate, sends an electronic signal confirming that your email is genuine and in active use. That is when the fraudster(s) really start to target you or your organisation.

Luckily, our skepticism about the email, not responding to it in any way, but immediately contacting Action Fraud, stopped the would-be fraudster from getting any further this time. We were given a crime number and advised to forward the email to <u>report@phishing.gov.uk</u> before deleting it and blocking the sender.

Our crime report to Action Fraud has added to data that will help detect patterns of activity and may even identify perpetrators to shut frauds down. But with over 41 million online frauds already reported to Action Fraud (<u>Action Fraud</u>, 2 June 2025), fraudsters only need to 'get lucky' a few times to cash in on their initial investment in buying up people's contact details.

<u>www.actionfraud.police.uk</u> and <u>www.gov.uk/report-suspicious-emails-websites-phishing</u> provide information about how to spot, (hopefully) avoid, and report frauds, scams and cybercrime if you are suspicious of an email, text, or website, or think you might have been a victim of this type of crime.
