Alumni Update — Haley Causeman

Haley is a Little Village alumni student. Her mom, Dawne shared the following as she knows we celebrate the successes of our former students:

We know how much our family at Little Village appreciates a feel good story about their alumni as well as celebrating their successes after their time at LV. Haley has a small group of "typical" friends that she's had since elementary school and they include her in almost everything and never ever treat her as if she has special needs. Right before Covid hit, she was in the middle of 6th grade and thriving, she was mainstreaming for multiple periods a day, was in clubs with her friends, we were able to leave her alone at playdates with this specific group of girls. Of course as we all know, the last year and a half of school has limited socialization so much but these girls never let her go. Two of them ran cross country last year and it got us thinking this year how it would be a perfect sport to "try" given that her limited communication and speech deficits wouldn't really come too much into play. We also knew she had a few of her friends on the team that would hopefully be able to bridge the communication gap between coaches, teammates etc. She was mainstreaming. As most of our special needs world knows, things like this aren't as easy



as just saying "let's try a sport this season" it take a village to make happen but everyone involved made it so easy for us and we couldn't have been more appreciative.

When we approached the Athletic Director at Salk Middle School, he never once hesitated and did whatever he could to make it happen. Her coaches were so incredible with Haley and always so proud of her and never ever treated her as someone with special needs but as just another one of their competitive runners. Her teammates, the way they rooted her on and included her in everything was the most incredible thing ever.

She now has new friends that she probably wouldn't ever have if it wasn't for this experience. Her closest friends on the team, the ones I spoke of earlier, I sometimes wondered who was more proud of her, us or the girls. These girls knew exactly the things she wouldn't be able to communicate and made sure those things were communicated to the coaches or other teammates, they knew exactly the things that I needed to know that Haley wouldn't be able to come home and tell us. I feel so blessed to have had them in her life all these years and we love watching them grow up and we are so grateful for them everyday. Our greatest joy was watching Haley thrive and soar through this journey, not only did we throw this cross country idea at her after she never had ever even run in a race in her life but she did it with all of her heart.

This was only supposed to be something to keep her busy and get her involved socially, it was an added bonus that she was good at it. Every meet, she bettered her team and was determined to improve and by mid season, she was finishing in the top 5 of the girls in her school! We watched her improve and challenge herself each meet and we have never ever been more proud of her. As parents, especially special needs, all we wish for is our kids to be accepted and loved and appreciated for who they are. It's been such a blessing to watch that happen in front of our eyes and to know it was possible because other kids turned a blind eye to a disability and just loved and appreciated her for who she is.

In closing, one of our favorite moments of the season was when her first teacher ever from Little Village, Rita came to watch her run in a race. All these years later, and our Little Village family keeps reminding us how lucky we were to begin our journey there. Thank you for asking us to write this and for following both our children's journeys with such admiration and love.




















Community Care RX Direct Support Professional of the Year Awards -
