PROPOSAL FOR BYLAW CHANGE-IMPORTANT! OFFICIAL NOTICE

The Board has agreed to submit a Bylaw change to the general membership regarding the elimination of the senior Honorary memberships. It was noted that approximately one third (1/3) of the club membership is now in the honorary category. The Board makes the recommendation that for 2019 to eliminate the honorary membership status. This is a financial consideration for the good of the Club. The Board is aware that some of the Seniors pay membership dues anyway in order to support the Club. This will be open for discussion at the September meeting on Sept 12th, 2018. If a motion is passed at the September meeting, there will be a vote at the October meeting. Additional Info: The Club uses the membership dues to pay for the Whopper Board prizes, trophy engraving, web site and newsletter costs, speakers dinners, etc. The Whopper Board alone involves \$1500 worth of prizes. With the current decreased membership, this does not balance out. Raffle income goes to the December banquet prizes. We do not make any money on trips either, nor do we make any money on your dinner at the Awards Banquet. The Board members have been paying for their own office supplies as well. Mr Davis has been paying himself for many years for newsletter printing and postage for those who don't/won't use a computer to read the newsletter. Also, he has donated the trophies/engraving many times already. This again reinforces our need to recruit new members to the Club.

Galley Minimums

In case you didn't know, on those boats with a Galley, we are expected to meet a minimum amount of dollars per contract for food and drink. This is hundreds of dollars. During one trip in 2018 the minimum was not met. We must be mindful to support the Galley on the boats. This means that members need to please remind guests ahead of time that they will be buying food on the boat. We need to make our Galley minimum.

Also along this same vein, we are all prohibited from bringing alcohol and drugs on the boats. (Boat Rules). The boats sell sufficient alcohol for normal consumption and it helps us reach our Galley minimum. **Do not bring alcohol on our Charters.** As for the drugs, the boats have to follow Federal drug laws, not State drug laws.

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TRIP DEPOSITS FOR 2019-IMPORTANT

The Board decided that the Club will no longer take partial deposits for trips and that you will be required to make the full payment for Clubs trips at the time you reserve it. Trips will be announced in December and reservations will start at the January meeting. The entire amount will be due when you reserves your trip. For example, if a trip is \$180, you will need to pay the full \$180 to reserve a spot at the time of the reservation. If you are bringing guests on the trip, they must pay the full amount also to hold their spot.

Trips are sold at every meeting and can be paid for by mail as well, but only for the full amounts. If you elect to pay in cash, please be sure to get a written receipt.

RAFFLE CHANGE EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY

The Board has determined that the Grand prize for the monthly meetings needs to be a member with current paid membership. If there are 2 Grand prizes, both must go to Club members. This means that if you have a guest buying raffle tickets, they are not eligible to win the Grand prize. However, they are eligible for all the other prizes. If a guest joins the Club that evening before the raffle with membership dues fully paid, then they are eligible for the Grand prize. The Board feels that membership has privileges and that this should be one of them. Please be aware that for raffles early in the year you will need to have your dues paid early in the year to have this privilege.

We arrived on Thursday and immediately head to the Quonset Hut, a local pizza place since 1946. It is a real Quonset hut, built by 2 vets after the war. The pizza is killer, with a thin flakey cracker like crust and toppings galore. We have extra to stash at the hotel. They also ship but we haven't tried that yet.

On Friday William anxiously awaited the arrival of his 2 young nephews from summer camp so he could play with them. We tried to be helpful around Mark's but other than a few errands he had things under control. Friday night Mark presents Quonset Hut pizza and fried chicken. Can't resist that pizza.

Saturday comes, and we are up early as we are taking the nephews to breakfast at Cracker Barrel. They have their own waitress there who serves them promptly and knows exactly what they want. They are their grits but the little one was too

excited to eat anything else. We tip the waitress big. She even had presents for the kids as one of them had had a birthday recently. The rest of the family has already started setting up at the park. The boys want to stop at the park on the way back from breakfast to see if the "jumpy thing" has arrived. It hasn't. OK that was Saturday. Sunday is a day of rest and eating leftovers. 'Nuf said.

Monday, we decided to take William's sister Kathy and her granddaughter, Gigi fishing at a local lake. The entire area is full of natural preserves that offer many outdoor activities. We checked at the local Bass Pro and the man said to go to Independence Grove. We looked it up online and it sounded good. Since we didn't bring any fishing gear, the ability to rent gear was a plus. The prediction was thunderstorms in the afternoon, so we got started with a good breakfast on the way in the a.m.

The preserve is run by Lake County. They have boat rentals and sell terminal tackle on site, as well as licenses and bait. Full year license in Illinois is \$15. What they didn't have was rental rods, so William bought them out on what they had, a Shakespeare combo and 2 Frozen rods by Zebco. The plan was shore fishing but all of a sudden William had rented a small pontoon boat too. It took a while to get squared away at the counter. The Lake rules are barbless hooks and it is catch and release only. This lake has bluegill, perch, bass, walleye and Muskie in it.

We boarded our pontoon boat. Much to our surprise, it was equipped with pedals rather than a motor. But there was no stopping us now. William and Gigi quickly got us off the dock and onto the lake. Our first couple of casts results in nothing. Then the guy from the landing showed up on his super powered raft and told us we were in a no fishing area and we had to fish the other part of the lake. We moved quickly. No sooner had we gone under the bridge to the other side when Kathy landed a bluegill. This was followed by a double hookup by Kathy and Gigi. William kept the boat in line and kept us from drifting into the weeds. The fish never stopped, all bluegill of varying sizes. I got more adventuresome and tried fishing the bottom. Each time my bait disappeared with one hit. I decided my hook was too small for whatever was down there. William and I kept busy helping Kathy and Gigi put on bait, remove fish. Gigi caught & released at least 20 fish in less than couple of hours and Kathy was in double digits too. So, there was a lot of put on bait, remove fish going on.

This was a great place to start a beginner fishing, as this was Gigi's first-time fishing. Yet it also offers challenges for the more advanced fisherman. William had the girls pedal back to the dock and we headed for ice cream, beating out the storm by a lot. Next time I am going prepared for the big ones!
