PREPARE A DISASTER KIT FOR YOUR HORSE

- 1. Emergency Information Packet on all horses
- 2. Work gloves
- 3. Buckets for each horse
- 4. Bucket hangers
- 5. Small bottle of bleach to disinfect stalls
- 6. Spray Bottle
- 7. Hand sanitizer
- 8. Paper Towel & garbage bag
- 9. First Aid Kit
 - First Aid book
 - wire cutters
 - sharp knife
 - bandages
 - scissors
 - disposable latex gloves
 - clippers or electric razor
 - elastic wraps
 - vet wraps
 - cotton bandages
 - compresses
 - towels
 - adhesive tape
 - surgical or bacterial soap and/or saline solution
 - alcohol
 - alcohol wipes
 - cotton wipes
 - scarlet oil
 - bute
 - large old syringe
 - Q tips
 - mineral oil

- turkey baster
- fly repellent
- antibacterial wound dressing
- liniment
- rectal veterinary thermometer
- stethoscope
- twitch
- duct tape
- 10. Markers, pens, writing tablet, and shoe polish white and/or black.
- 11. Prescription meds & copy of the prescription
- 12. Extra halters, lead ropes, lung line
- 13. Baling twine
- 14. Two sided snaps
- 15. Small pieces of leather or leather shoe laces to repair broken tack
- 16. Electrolytes (see attached recipe from CSU)
- 17. Leg wraps
- 18. Blankets or sheets
- 19. Brushes, scraper, hoof pick
- 20. Hose
- 21. Shovel or manure fork and muck bucket
- 22. Portable radio and extra batteries
- 23. Flashlight and extra batteries
- 24. A few bottles of water

Check contents every 6 months to rotate medical supply.

3 days of hay, grain, and supplements

Keep tote in horse trailer or near door of tack room or barn.

This list is also applicable for non-commercial livestock such as goats, pigs, cows, etc.
