



STAY SAFE

It's time to celebrate the 4th of July — time to have fun with family and friends. Whether it is at the beach, on the boat, grilling in the backyard or setting off a firecracker or two, PLAY IT SAFE.

SPARKLER & FIREWORKS SAFETY

More than 50,000 fires are caused by fireworks every year. Take the proper precautions when operating fireworks.

- Never disassemble or try to make your own fireworks.
- Don't point sparklers, or fireworks at yourself or others, especially while they're being lit.
- ♦ Only light fireworks on the ground and in areas that are dry and fire resistant.
- Don't attempt to light multiple devices at the same time or re-light a "dud".
- Never allow young children to handle fireworks or sparklers.

Always keep a portable fire extinguisher close by. Also keep a water hose or buckets of water nearby to put out fires.

WATER ACTIVITY SAFETY

July is one of the hottest months of the year, and many families turn to water activities to beat the heat. However, even fun water activities have serious risks if you don't follow proper precautions:

- Never consume alcohol while driving a boat.or swimming
- Before boating, always check that there are enough life preservers on hand for every passenger.
- ♦ Keep alert for local weather conditions at the beach. Check to see if any warning signs or flags are posted.
- ♦ Protect the neck don't dive head first.
- Pools should be enclosed completely with a fence to restrict access to the area.
- Use waterproof sunscreen.

Keep a first aid kit near the pool.



GRILLING SAFETY

Enjoy grilling your favorite meals this summer while also keeping your family safe.

- ♦ Check gas grill hoses for cracks, holes and leaks, which can cause fires and explosions..
- Keep children away from grills.
- Don't leave the grill unattended.
- Never grill indoors, in the garage, in any enclosed area or on a surface that might catch fire.

Keep the grill at least two feet away from decks, siding, branches and any outdoor equipment that can catch fire quickly.

If you follow these simple 4th of July safety tips, your entire family will be sure to have a safe and memorable holiday.

Lake Ridge has MATURE <u>FREE</u>TREES for your front yard!


As many of you know, the City of Fort Lauderdale has put together an Adopt—A-Tree Program over the last few years to encourage the planting of trees in the neighborhoods around the city. There are many benefits to having more tree canopy in the neighborhoods as it not only beautifies the area but also shades the sidewalks and roads helping to "cool the city" and it significantly slows traffic along neighborhood roads.

The Lake Ridge community is excited to welcome Mr. Mark Williams to the City of Fort Lauderdale staff who will be

heading up the Adopt-A-Tree city grant program replacing our dear friend the late Gene Dempsy. The Adopt-A-Tree program has been very successful over the last 3 years in Lake Ridge where over 200 trees have been planted! Strolling through Lake Ridge you can see many Royal Poinciana Trees, Live oaks, Bulnesias and Crepe Myrtles planted along many different streets offering vibrant colors and new shade as they grow.

The great news is Lake Ridge has been advised by Mr. Williams that we still have some trees available to us through our grant with the City of Fort Lauderdale, all we need is spots to place them with the commitment they will be watered. There are Live Oaks, Jacarandas, Royal Poincianas, Bulnesias among others. The City of Fort Lauderdale not only gives you a lovely, good size tree, but they also come and plant it for you staked, fertilized and mulched in your front yard for **FREE**!!

This is a wonderful opportunity to help Lake Ridge create more shade, slow our neighborhood traffic and beautify our community.



If you would like a tree planted in your front yard please complete the Adopt-A-Tree form and email it to **LRCA33304@gmail.com**. Forms can also be picked up and dropped off at our general meetings, or email us at and we will send you a form to complete.

If you don't have room in your front yard but see somewhere that could use a beautiful blooming tree around the neighborhood, please ask the homeowner if they would like

to Adopt-A –Tree or get their email and we can send a note along with the form!! We need to create shade, beautify the neighborhood and calm the traffic through our neighborhood streets. Many people would love to have a FREE blooming tree planted in their front yard, they just don't know anything about the free tree program. TRAFFIC NOTES

SUNRISE BOULEVARD IMPROVEMENTS

You may have seen recent detours on Sunrise Boulevard. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) recently closed traffic in the overnight hours to remove the overhead signs spanning the road near 10th and 18th Avenues. This is part of a project to improve pedestrian safety along Sunrise. The large footprints of these overhead signs obstructed the sidewalks, leaving only 2 feet of clearance — far less than is needed for a wheelchair to pass comfortably.

FDOT has also announced plans to install crosswalks across Sunrise in front of the Gateway Theater and along the south side of Sunrise near Searstown. No date has been announced for installation to begin, but don't be surprised if you see more detours on Sunrise. LRCA has been asking FDOT to address pedestrian safety and comfort along this busy roadway, and it's nice to see results.

As part of the plan for redevelopment near the Galleria, FDOT has been studying ways to improve vehicular traffic flow along Sunrise. They recently issued a conceptual plan. One idea is to replace the existing Gateway intersection with a traffic circle. Another proposal is to "add" a second left turn lane from eastbound Sunrise to northbound NE 15th Avenue into Lake Ridge. This so-called "dynamic left turn" would have a changeable signal that would direct traffic in a current straight-through lane into a left-turn movement instead. This would only be activated during peak hours. Currently, the left turn lane is too short to handle all turning traffic, when it backs up it clogs straight-through travel lanes. Both of these concepts have some operational difficulties. We'll keep you posted on the discussions between the state, county and city, and the plans as they develop.
