Transfiguration and the Meaning of True Independence

Every year on July 4th, the United States of America pauses to remember a bold and defining moment in its history: the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. This day marks the birth of a nation founded on the ideals of liberty, justice, and self-governance, a country built upon the belief that all people are created equal and are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, including life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

But as Christians, when we speak of "freedom" and "independence," we are invited to look deeper. True freedom is not just a political or national reality, it is a spiritual calling, a transformation of the heart and soul. And there is no greater image of transformation in our faith than the Transfiguration of our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Light of the Transfiguration

In the Gospels, we read of the moment when Jesus took Peter, James, and John up a high mountain, traditionally identified as Mount Tabor, and was transfigured before them. "His face shone like the sun, and His clothes became dazzling white" (Matthew 17:2). Moses and Elijah appeared beside Him, representing the Law and the Prophets, and a cloud overshadowed them as the voice of God proclaimed:

"This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well pleased. Listen to Him." (Matthew 17:5)

This moment was not merely a miracle to astonish the disciples. It was a revelation, a glimpse into Christ's divine nature and the future glory of His resurrection. The disciples were being prepared for what lay ahead: the suffering of the cross and the ultimate triumph of the resurrection.

It is important to realize that the Transfiguration was not a moment of escape from the world, but a moment of clarity in the world. It did not take Jesus or His followers out of their earthly mission but rather gave them strength and vision to fulfill it. It is the same with us: we are not called to retreat from our responsibilities or communities but to be transfigured within them, to become people of light in a world that often walks in darkness.

A Different Kind of Independence

When we think about independence, we honor the sacrifice of the men and women who risked their lives for freedom. The founding of the United States was not just a rebellion against tyranny, it was a bold (Continued on the back page)





statement that the dignity and freedom of every human being are sacred, given by God and not to be taken away by any earthly power.

However, Christian independence goes even deeper than political liberty. It is the independence of the soul, a freedom from the bondage of sin, fear, hatred, and death. As Saint Paul writes,

"For freedom Christ has set us free. Stand firm, therefore, and do not submit again to a yoke of slavery." (Galatians 5:1)

Christ offers independence from the very roots of human suffering. Through Christ, we are no longer enslaved by our past, our guilt, our pride, or our despair. We are called to walk in newness of life, a life illuminated by the grace of God.

Living as Transfigured Citizens

As Americans, we are grateful for the freedoms we enjoy, freedom to speak, to worship, to live, and to serve. These freedoms are not to be taken for granted or used selfishly. They are entrusted to us so we may live responsibly, care for one another, seek justice, and lift up those who are in need.

And as Christians, we are reminded that we are not just citizens of a nation, we are citizens of the Kingdom of Heaven. Our highest allegiance is to God. And our true freedom is found not in independence from others, but in dependence on Him.

In the Transfiguration, the disciples saw the truth of who Jesus really was, His divine light shining through His human body. In our own lives, we are called to reflect that same light. We are called to be transfigured: to become more Christ-like, to live with holiness, humility, and compassion. This is the greatest freedom of all, the freedom to become who God created us to be.

Our True Independence

On this Fourth of July, as fireworks light up the sky and the flag waves proudly in the summer breeze, let us give thanks for the blessings we enjoy as members of a free country. But even more, let us strive for the deeper freedom, the freedom that comes through Christ.

Let us remember that political liberty is a precious gift, but spiritual liberty is eternal. The light that shone on Mount Tabor still shines for us today, calling us to be transfigured by grace, and to live not only as Americans, but as disciples of the Living God.

May we walk in that light with faith, with courage, and with love, seeking not only the freedom to live, but the freedom to love, to serve, and to become like Christ.

Happy Independence Day and may your life be filled with the transforming light of Christ our Lord.
