1st Corinthians 15: 20 "But Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep."

I write on the Monday prior to the 3nd Sunday in Lent, March 3, 2024. During lent there are many terms that are used that are not always common and used often. One of those terms is Triduum. I discovered that triduum denotes a three-day period of prayer, usually in preparation for an important feast or in celebration of that feast. Triduum also recalls the three days that Christ spent in the tomb, from Good Friday until Easter Sunday.

Of course, the best-known triduum is the Paschal or Easter Triduum, which begins with the service of the Lord's Supper on the evening of Maundy Thursday and continues until the start of second vespers (evening prayer) on Easter Sunday. Triduum is also known as (when capitalized) Paschal Triduum, Holy Triduum, or Easter Triduum. If I were to ask you the question, "How will you be spending the Triduum?" Your response would probably be, "The what?" And on a good day my response would be, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter?"

Maundy Thursday, the first day of the Triduum, is described by the World Council of Churches BEM Document as follows:

"The last meal celebrated by Jesus was a liturgical meal employing symbolic words and actions. Consequently, the Eucharist is a sacramental meal which by visible signs communicates to us God's love in Jesus Christ, the love by which Jesus loved his own "to the end" (John 13:1). It has acquired many names: for example, the Lord's Supper, the breaking of bread, the Holy Communion, the Divine Liturgy, the mass. Its celebration continues as the central act of the church's worship." Inherent and also quite explicit in the three days of the Maundy Thursday, Good Friday and Easter is this succinct yet powerfully spiritual affirmation of faith: Christ has died. Christ is risen. Christ will come again. Especially as Zion seeks to reach our ministry dreams, I hope you will gather on the three most consequential days of the church calendar and pray for the church. Please consider joining us in our Maundy Thursday meal/Service and finally join us on the Triduum.

Wednesday Lenten Bible Study


