## MARY CASSATT -

was unusual in her lifetime, choosing an art career over marriage and family. She had to overcome many prejudices to follow through her passion to be an artist. Her drive and determination ensured that she continued to innovate and develop her artistic practices throughout her career.

The paintings, prints and sketches she produced have given us a wealth of material to study and inspire.

This presentation is set in 1911. By 1912, Cassatt had become partially blind. She gave up painting entirely in 1915. She had become totally blind by her death in 1926 in Mesnil-Beaufresne, France.
