The above paragraph was not proofed by Linda. I wanted to wait until the newsletter was in print, before she saw that she got slammed.



# Hey, Barbecue Bill

In October, Bart Williams, Dr. Charles McKenzie and I met with the Forest Service and Keith Dupont of the Corps of Engineers to discuss the possibility of obtaining a grant for trail relocation and a sewer system for Cobb Ridge camp ground. Well, things have moved along quite well.

The Corps of Engineers are contributing their time. What does this mean? 35 engineers for 7 days, 10 hours per day. Plus equipment. Working on the trail relocation. So, they are pretty much going to move in. The Forest Service is going to provide materials and guidance.

We, the Ozark Mountain Trail Riders, have been asked to help. Time contributed counts toward the grant and we have been asked to contribute some time. What do we need? We need your commitment. This is currently scheduled for June. No exact date has been set yet. After working 10-hour days, the engineers are going to be hungry, and we have been asked to cook for them. The cost of the food has been added to the grant. But, we need to get organized and plan on having three members per day to cook dinner and hopefully breakfast.

So we are going to need 21 members (3 per day) to step forward and sign up for this. I'll have more as things settle down and the dates get set.


I really hadn't planning on riding the first Hill Billy Grand Prix at Marshfield, MO. It was the morning after the OM-




