Retirees take their place to set policy for NYSUT

We know how powerful a union NYSUT has become when we read our newsletters, NYSUT UNITED, and the local city newspapers, and see what has been accomplished for Retirees and in-service members. It certainly shows when reporters analyze the NYS Budget for the coming year which was passed last week. Although a week late, it answered many requests for monies. Included in the budget were increases to issues we advocate for school funding, Higher Ed (which has been starved for years), and funding for mental health for children and adults, giving attention to the price of gas and the inflation we have all been facing. Your lobbing can take some credit for all of that. All this good news was delivered by the NYSUT Representative Assembly's special guest, Governor Kathy Hochul! It had been a long time since a governor has addressed a NYSUT convention and, with such a good message, she was very well received.

As Retirees, 80% of our pensions stay in New York State to help sustain the communities we live in and our votes help make the political rhetoric find funding and action.

RC 7's delegates' votes at the policing making body of NYSUT, the Representative Assembly, fill that same task through passing proposed resolutions submitted by locals on a variety of subjects including Retiree issues. Retirees now make up about one third of the organization, and it is our responsibility to be heard and promote what we believe is best for the organization's agenda, including Retirees.

This year's convention passed resolutions to advocate for temporarily improving the calculation of the final average salary for Tier III through Tier VI, but, as in other years, proposals to grant credit for non - public school service was not passed because it could cause a problem to the financial strength of the retirement systems.

Other resolutions concerning Retirees were referred to the NYSUT Board of Directors for further study. They included the right to use Member Benefits, that Members can join NEA as pre-retired life members, to consider adding an SRP Representative to the NYSUT Board, and to form a Task Force to review increasing the voting power of Retirees. Other committees that reviewed proposed resolutions included Healthcare & Workplace Safety, Educational Issues, and, of course, Legislative & Political Action.

Margo Buckingham, Candy Johnson, and I were elected to represent you! Margo and I attended the convention this year. Participating in this endeavor always invigorates us to advocate for a strong union and for a dignified retirement for all.

Together, with all of you, we remain UNION FOR LIFE!
