Program Highlights

- 7-night (9 day) journey through Chile and Argentina
- Visit & explore healthcare/OT/PT/rehabilitation facilities and programs; explore and compare Chilean & Argentine culture; and meet and interact with citizens of both nations.

Professional Interaction

- Learn about occupational therapy, physical therapy, rehabilitation and medical systems in both countries as the group learns about methods of OT, PT, and rehabilitation education, culture and history of Chile and Argentina through lectures and interactions with occupational therapists and other professionals.
- Understanding the factors that drive health care and educational systems in OT in other countries will help you develop partnerships and build relationships that support sustainable programs and services.

Focus on Community & Culture

- Talk to the people you meet on the street. You'll be delighted at how open to conversation the locals are, and you may surprise yourself with the new impressions formed.
- Discuss and observe Chilean and Argentinian daily life, communication styles and beliefs with the local people.
- Get to know the distinctive cultural touchstones of the countries, including a tango class as well as a professional Tango show; a Gaucho cowboy experience and traditional Adobo (BBQ) lunch
- Explore local markets including Mercado Central in Santiago.
