I sat in the office for hours trying to come up with some word of hope or encouragement. I was looking for some scripture of comfort. I was searching for words of action that could lead to change, something that could rise to the tension and pain I was feeling; no such words arrived. I felt powerless to speak on what I believe is rapidly becoming the manifestation of the largest societal mistakes of generations. A week prior, I like many in our area, sent my children back to school for the first day of the academic year. Less than a week later, we as a nation have had our first mass casualty school shooting of the new school year. Every one of these tragic events hits hard. This one in particular because it is so senseless, so early in the school year, and the victims are the same age as my children. I was searching for the right words because I believed I had to speak again on this topic, on the violence and behaviors that contributed to this horrible act; to once again bring up guns, and mental health, and parenting and all of the other aspects at play; but I just couldn't find the words. In the absence of the right word I set out to do, to keep busy, doing actionable things to keep my mind occupied since the words had deserted me. I spoke with our Preschool director to once again go over all of the safety precautions we have in place for the church's preschool, I had a conversation with the Mars Chief of police to discuss community safety and to ask for an increased police presence around the preschool for their first weeks of school, I sat in prayer, and I bemoaned the obviously jaded responses from online chat groups that immediately turned this recent loss of children's lives into political fodder all while trying to place blame on others. I didn't want violence and hatred to be the focal point of the church newsletter, and I still don't. That's when the right Word found me. "In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God." (John 1:1-2) Jesus is the Word, "And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth." (John 1:14) God never promised an easy or perfect life, but Christ did offer us a new way of living. A way of life centered on love that could change the world, and indeed did change the world



on the cross! The bible tells us that God is love. (1 John 4:8) Jesus reminds us time and time again to focus on love. Love of God, love of neighbor, love of outcast, love of stranger, love of alien, love of enemy. We are supposed to love others. I believe this is the key to a better world. The key to a world with less or maybe someday no gun violence.

When this new word, love, came to my mind at first I tried to dismiss it. How could something so simple be the answer. Yet the more I thought, the more I realized there is nothing simple about loving the way Christ teaches us to love. To love the hard to love, to be in uncomfortable situations while genuinely caring for the other, to reach out to the margins and live your life outside of the comfortable routines we have created. Love is a simple word, but a powerful action. Love changes lives.

I can't help but wonder if Robin Westman had been loved by their community if things might have been different. This isn't by way of blaming her parents or those closest to her, this is acknowledging that it takes a village and love is needed everywhere. If peers and adults alike genuinely cared and showed interested and sat with and loved other, would it have made a difference? Perhaps they did, perhaps they tried, perhaps they are just like us. The truth is I'll never know for sure what love Robin did or did not receive, but I do know that "Love covers a multitude of sins". (1 Peter 4:8) It is too late for love to cover this recent tragic sinful act, but maybe, just maybe, it isn't too late for love to cover the next, to prevent a future tragedy, to help a neighbor in need of love, to change a life so that lives are saved. I encourage you to love today, to conquer hate

with love, to focus on kindness instead of hostility. I ask that you take an interest in people's lives, ask kids how they are doing, let them know you care.

Wherever it is, at church, in your community, at the store, love more, love to the extreme, because we as disciples are striving to live like Jesus Christ our Lord, and Christ is Love. In the end, while my heart aches today, I know that love wins. Christ wins! Because of love, I have hope, and you do too!






